Madagascar: an ecological village to cope with climate change



Development and Peace's *People and Planet First* campaign celebrates what solidarity can achieve, even against seemingly impossible odds.

In Madagascar, for instance, Development and Peace's partner, the Development Council of Andohatapenaka (CDA), empowers people to manage and transform their neighbourhoods.

In the capital region, which is afflicted by flooding and poor waste management, CDA has helped the residents of one vulnerable area to turn their environs into a thriving ecological village. Today, each of the 50 households involved in the project has a vegetable garden, a stove and solar panels. This transformation reflects a true ecological conversion.

March 12th & 13th – 2nd Sunday in Lent

Dear parishioners, there came a point in the ministry of Jesus when events took a turn for the worse and a decision had to be made regarding its future direction. Accompanied by three of His closest associates, Peter, James and John, Jesus retired up the mountain to seek the guidance of God the Father in quiet prayer. As Jesus prayed, He seemed to be fully taken up into another world. His face was bathed in light and at His side were Moses the law-giver and Elijah the prophet. Deep in conversation with them He was made aware of the full extent of His suffering and death. It was only through the passion and cross that He would come to the glory of the resurrection.

The purpose of the transfiguration was to make the apostles aware of the divine presence of the man with whom they walked and talked and to establish beyond all doubt in their minds that Jesus was the Son of God. It revealed to the disciples who their master really was and by giving them a taste of future glory. It prepared them for the understanding of the passion of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

After the passion event, they discovered that following their master would involve huge sacrifices, great acts of charity and love beyond our imagination. Christ was inviting them to crawl up the hill of Calvary and carve their names on the foot of the cross.

Lent affords an opportunity, through prayer and fasting, for putting the house of our soul in spiritual shape. It teaches us that the road to heaven is by the sweat of our brow along with putting up with times of frustrations and disappointments in life. The transfiguration is about letting the glory of God shine through us so that others can catch a glimpse of God's glory in our acts of mercy and charity towards others.
