CEC reminds members to prioritize winter safety

At Choctaw Electric Cooperative, safety is of utmost importance.

It's a commitment we uphold year-round. Our team dedicates thousands of hours annually to safety training to ensure the well-being of our employees and our members.

With winter weather on the horizon, I encourage everyone to take a few simple precautions to stay safe. If you have a generator, please ensure it's safely installed with a transfer switch to prevent backfeed into utility lines, which can endanger lineworkers. It's also wise to keep essential items on hand—flashlights, batteries, non-perishable food, and warm clothing—so you're prepared for potential outages. Rest assured, CEC is ready with plans in place to restore power as quickly and safely as possible if outages do occur.

When decorating outdoors, be cautious around power lines. Keep ladders and decorations a safe distance from overhead lines. Indoors, check your electrical cords and power strips, avoiding overloaded circuits, which can be a fire hazard. For added protection, use surge protectors or power strips with circuit breakers when plugging in multiple lights or decorations. Take extra care when using space heaters and candles, ensuring they're not too close to anything combustible.

Your safety is at the heart of everything we do at Choctaw Electric Cooperative. Please stay vigilant, and don't hesitate to contact us if you have questions about electrical safety. We wish you a safe and joyful Christmas season and a bright and prosperous new year!

Preserving Our Legacy: CEC Launches 85th Anniversary History Project

In 2025, Choctaw Electric Cooperative will proudly celebrate 85 years of service. We're marking this milestone with a special project to preserve the co-op's rich history. Our 85th anniversary history project aims to gather, organize and digitize a collection of photos and memorabilia that tell the story of CEC and the communities we serve. Some of these images date back decades, capturing the faces of co-op members, employees, and key moments in our journey—though many remain unidentified.

Kenny Sivard, CEC's purchasing agent and a board member of the Oklahoma Historical Society (OHS), recognized the value of preserving these memories for future generations. In November, he delivered the first batch of

photos to the OHS, where they will be digitized and made part of the OHS's Gateway to Oklahoma History. This collection will be stored in high resolution and accessible to the public, ensuring our legacy remains alive and available for years to come.


