High winds and tornadoes drive up interest in CEC's storm shelter program

here's nothing like tornado warnings and 80+ mph winds to get Lacey Peters' phone ringing. Peters, coordinator of the storm shelter program at Choctaw Electric Cooperative (CEC), says storms like the one that hit southeast Oklahoma on March 2 usually prompt members to take action.

"People tend to wait until after a storm hits and then boom, boom, boom, my phone starts ringing," Peters said.

Strong storms tend to remind people how vulnerable they are to the weather, she added. Peters received five applications the day after the March 2 storm and calls have continued since.

CEC's Storm Shelter program makes a safe shelter easy and affordable by allowing members to finance their purchase and make small monthly payments on their electric bill.

Members may choose from a variety of sizes and safety options. Special features include ventilation fans, vacuum-locked door, and hand rails on steps. An optional staircase design offers a more gradual slope, making access easier for some people.

Both in-ground shelters and above-ground safe rooms are available. Prices begin at \$3,450 and includes installation and delivery.

e've had our share of storms over the past three months and this was before official kick-off of tornado season! With the oddball weather on my mind, I'd like to focus on a topic that is important to me—safety.

There are reasons I'm a huge safety advocate. At the top of my list are the 62 individuals working

for Choctaw Electric Cooperative (CEC), plus our 14,875 members and their families. When you provide an energy source as potent as electricity, you can't be slaphappy about human lives.

Over the years, I've heard a number of heartbreaking stories about co-op personnel who died while doing the jobs they'd done for years. One slip, one small mistake, is all it takes. As convenient and necessary as electricity is to our lives, it's also deadly and unforgiving.

That's why this time of year makes me a bit anxious. At CEC, we make darn sure our employees are aware of the dangers they face on the job. Our line crews and field personnel are reminded of the hazards through consistent training and regular safety meetings. They make this learning a priority because they know their lives depend on it.

The average person isn't so 'in tune' with electrical hazards. These folks worry me. If a trained professional can fall victim to a fatal misjudgment around electricity, it stands to reason the average person could, too. Usually, when they least expect it.

In the spring, we spend more time outdoors. We're busy trimming trees, doing yard work, moving equipment, cleaning out the pool, and making repairs to our home exterior. That's the short list of tasks that drive us outside and almost all of them take place near power lines. Our awareness and respect for those lines can make the difference between life and death.

Severe thunderstorms often leave a tangle of safety hazards. CEC crews try to repair these problems as fast as possible, but we can't be everywhere at once. If you spot a downed line or a wire dangling among the tree limbs, by all means, stay away and report it immediately. Please

call CEC as soon as possible or report the problem using Smarthub. We also urge you to notify your local law enforcement of the problem.

Hanging from the pole or lying flat on the ground, hot lines are deadly. Don't take chances by assuming otherwise.

If what I've said makes you hesitate before you raise a ladder or drive your hay baler under a low-hanging wire— good. It means you're exercising caution around power lines.

At CEC, safety is a state of mind. We want to encourage the same in you. Please be aware and stay safe.




Prepaid members can pay as they go along. When and how much they pay is up to them. This freedom helps prepaid accounts avoid a big bill at the end of the month.
