New Program For CEC Members Can Lower Home Energy Costs

Sign up for a free home energy audit before summer arrives

Summer is coming, and with it is increased energy use. How serious are you about getting a handle on your home energy costs? Are you serious enough to have a professional take a close look at how your home uses energy?

During the month of May only, Choctaw Electric Cooperative (CEC) is offering members the chance to receive a whole-home energy audit performed by Precision Building Performance. The audit is free for CEC members.

The audit will include the following:

• A thorough inspection of your ducts for possible leaks where you may be losing energy.

Did You Know?

You could save 5 to 30 percent on your energy bill by making efficiency upgrades identified in your energy audit.

- An inspection of your attic to make sure your insulation is installed properly and applied evenly.
- A professional blower door test to detect air leaks in your home. To conduct the test, the auditor closes the windows and doors, and uses a blower door machine to depressurize the home.

According CEC Energy Use Specialist Brad Kendrick, the audit is extremely thorough and will examine your home from top to bottom. Once complete, members receive a detailed list of audit findings, along with suggestions on what they can do to improve their home's energy efficiency. Each suggestion includes an estimation of the potential savings gained. By addressing some of issues located in the audit, CEC members could save from five to 30 percent on home energy costs.

Members must own a traditional built home with a crawl space or concrete foundation to gain the audit's full benefit. To find out if you qualify, or to schedule an energy audit, please call CEC at **800-760-6486**. th

Safety Is Non-Negotiable

At CEC, every month is Electrical Safety Month

ay is recognized as National Electrical Safety Month, but when you're in the business of providing electricity, *every* month is electrical safety month.

At Choctaw Electric, we beat the safety drum for good reason: The electricity we deliver that brings us hot water, lights, TV, comfortable homes and so much more, also has the potential to cause significant injuries and deaths. Electricity is part of our lives almost every moment of every day; it's also an energy force that deserves and demands our respect.

As manager of Choctaw Electric Cooperative (CEC), the safety and well being of co-op employees, members and the general public is extremely serious to me. Your trustees, too, make safety a top priority. Every month, they carefully review CEC's safety report and reiterate the importance of safety at every meeting.

While electric utilities have greatly improved their safety record over the years, we realize there is little margin for error in this business. The necessity of training, rigorous protocol, and improved equipment are non-negotiable. We don't cut corners when it comes to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of our employees, our members, or the general public. To do that would be like putting a price on the value of human life. Recently, CEC joined the nationwide Commitment to Zero Contacts. Established by the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association and Federated Rural Electric Insurance Exchange, this program provides resources reduce injuries and

provides resources to help co-ops reduce injuries and deaths due to contact with electricity. As part of the pledge, CEC commits to work practices such as using life saving rules; wearing proper safety equipment; practicing established safety rules for clearance; slowing down and thinking through each job; and speaking up and refusing to accept any shortcut to safe work.

Yes, all of the above are practices we already emphasize at CEC. Our team also attends monthly meetings at our statewide association that emphasize safety skills. But the pledge gives all of this renewed emphasis. These and scores of other proven safety practices can never grow dull in the minds of those who work with electricity. We will keep hammering the safety message because keeping people alive and well is a never-ending concern.

Spring has sprung, which means it's time to clean your HVAC unit. Often when I visit homes, I find HVAC unit filters are dirty and haven't been replaced in months. Clogged coils and dirty air filters restrict air flow. Have your system serviced and cleaned before summer sets in. It will help with your cooling bills, and your home's comfort level. Remember to change your filters monthly. Also, check to make sure you are getting good airflow at each register and return vent. tip: Keep your thermostat ng to "Auto" so it is not continuously. By doing ou can save you a lot.

Asparagus Side Dish

INGREDIENTS

- 1 bunch fresh asparagus, trimmed
- 2/3 cup water
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 10 grape tomatoes, halved

DIRECTIONS

Combine the asparagus and water in a 10 inch skillet and place over medium heat; cover. Allow the asparagus to steam until tender, about 10 minutes; drain. Reduce heat to low and return the skillet to the heat. Drizzle olive oil over the asparagus; sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. Add the grape tomatoes to the skillet and replace the lid. Allow to sit covered until the cheese melts and the tomatoes are slightly steamed, about 2 minutes.
