We're inviting church members, families and groups to volunteer to host a trunk. It's simple:


- Decorate your car trunk in a fun, family-friendly theme

Unleashing Potential Outreach Mission

One of Emanuel's other mission projects is done through the Gifts for Baby Jesus (also known as Birthday Presents for the Birthday Child) which began in 1989. This project supports Unleashing Potential (the former Caroline Mission). UP is a part of an after school programming and tutoring service that is in over 50 schools in the St. Louis Metro area. Some of the impact of UP can be seen in the preschool program where all the students meet or exceed standards for kindergarten readiness. High school students are graduating from high school and many are attending some form of continuing education. They are providing them an opportunity for jobs that will provide a livable income and lead them to becoming productive members of the community.
