





**Saturday, March 1 is Clean-Up day at the Clothing Closet!** Those able and willing, please show up by **9:00 am** ready to scrub and work!!!

Anne Fields and Barb Chaney have already done some work on removing things that are no longer needed, including several bags to be donated to Teen Challenge.

This past Saturday, February 8, Barb Chaney, Shirley McCormack, and Emma Brockmire volunteered at the Clothing Closet and welcomed seven who came through and found items they needed. The ladies stayed after they closed and started boxing things up to make them easier to move for the upcoming March 1 Clean -Up Day.

Kelly suggested that the ladies who volunteer often provide a list of priorities for Clean-Up Day: containers, shelving, new blinds, floor cleaning, fresh paint, deep cleaning, rearranging things, etc.

Heavy cleaning is most beneficial as of right now

Woodwork/trim is very yucky and needs a fresh coat of paint (but new paint may not be possible at the March 1 date)

Carpet is scheduled to have a good cleaning on the March 1 date

A future service project for our Confirmands was to have them help in adding fresh paint to the Clothing Closet at another future date.

#### **Fundraising for 2025**

With the change of leadership of the Noon Optimist Club of Jackson, it is not as likely we will be hosting luncheons this year, which was a wonderful way to raise funds to support our various missions. That being said, Erica Cooper will reach out to Noon Optimist presidents Amy Ybara and Sarah Gereau about hosting future luncheons on the fifth Wednesday of the month (the next one would be in April).

Catheryn Hartle brought two ideas to the group:

**Butter Braids:** Since Spice of Life has dissolved into Women's Fellowship as a whole, they will no longer carry on the annual Butter Braids fundraiser. After discussion, it was decided that Women's Fellowship will now take this on.

**That's My Pan:** While this has been successful in the past, it doesn't have as good of profit margins as Butter Braids, even with bonuses offered after benchmark items sold. Benefits include a low minimum order and quick turnaround time of 1-2 weeks, but a large hindrance is cost of shipping, which isn't included and cuts further into profit margins

Joy Kessler suggested looking into selling trash bags like several area organizations, and Christy Bock agreed to check with a friend about this for further information.

#### **Blood Drive**

Catheryn Hartle brought forward the possibility of hosting a Red Cross Blood Drive at Emanuel. It was agreed upon, and Catheryn will take further action to reach out to the Red Cross and find out more details.

#### Mother's Day Luncheon

Erica Cooper shared that the theme for this year's Mother's Day Luncheon is "My Cup Overflows" (Psalm 23:5) and Hannah (Shinn) Rinehart will be our speaker.

Erica also asked for volunteers to help after the clean-up of the event to take home some of the unwanted plastic containers home to wash and return to church for use after various church meals. A large amount of plastic containers that are used at the luncheon are often thrown away when they are microwave, dishwasher, and freezer safe - and *perfect* for single portions. Stay tuned for more updates about this special event to be held **Saturday, May 10 at 11:00 am**.


