Previous minutes were available for review. Motion for approval of previous minutes made by Matt R. and seconded by Kelly. Council approved.

Treasurer and Financial reports given by Pat Holley. Will file for audit.

Pat noted concerns with giving vs. operating expenses. Ideas were given to attract more giving members. Possibly offering a contemporary service on a different day. It was decided to form a focus group to evaluate interest and determine a direction for the church. Pastor Josh will put together a survey and send it to the Stewardship committee and Council for review and approval.

Report of Committees

Buildings and grounds report:

- 1. There was a water main break going to the rental house. Langford Mechanical fixed the break and replaced the sidewalk. Since it was on our side of the meter, all of this is expected to be our expense. Even replacement of the sidewalk.
- 2. The rental house roof needs replaced. A quote from Hunter for the ridge cap only (\$500) or entire roof replacement (\$8031.07). A motion was made by Matt R. to replace the entire roof pending approval by the congregation. Matt Z. second. Motion passed.

A motion to call a Special Congregational Meeting on June 1, 2025 to seek approval for spending over \$5000 was made by Matt R. Katie second. Motion passed.

<u>Rental property:</u> The renter is leaving this summer. He has completed his Master's degree and is looking for a larger place. The council recommended looking for a new tenant by word of mouth.


