



Members of the Women's Fellowship met on Sunday, August 10 following worship. Fifteen members were in attendance.

Catheryn opened the business meeting. Treasurer, Earlene Sokolowski reported a balance on hand of \$6,578.28.

Officers for Next Year—2026

Officer elections will be held at the November 9 meeting. Current officers agreeing to continue in their current role: Earlene Sokolowski--Treasurer and Kelly Crawford--Vice-President. Anyone interested in taking the office of President or Secretary should contact Catheryn Hartle.

Fundraising Opportunities

Butter Braids—This was formerly a fundraiser sponsored by Spice of Life. Since that group was dissolved, it was suggested that Women's Fellowship continue with this project. After discussion, the group decided to hold the Butter Braid fundraiser in October. Anticipated profit margin is approximately 40%. Products would be delivered before Thanksgiving.

Trash Bags

Catheryn provided information about selling trash bags. The minimum purchase amount would be 250 rolls. They have assorted sizes and prices. After discussion, the consensus was not to pursue this fundraiser.

Noon Optimist Luncheon

Debra spoke on behalf of Alyssa Rau (she was out of town) about the possibility of working with the Jackson Noon Optimist Club. The club is in the planning stages for the next Optimist year. Being aware that Delmonico's (the club's current meeting place on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of the month) may be sold, the club is looking for other places to hold their monthly meetings as well as special 5th Wednesday meetings. Alyssa Rau (incoming Secretary of the Optimist Club) offered the possibility of using the church facilities for their meetings, pending council approval, etc. The club asked if it would be a possibility for the Women's Fellowship to provide lunch on some of those meeting days—details would have to discussed further. Alyssa Rau and Ann Fields are both members of the Noon Optimist Club board of directors and can provide further information. A decision will be made later after we obtain more information.

Ignite Worship

The new Ignite Worship Experience will begin on Saturday, August 23 at 5:30 pm in the Fellowship Hall. Pastor Josh is asking for volunteers to provide cookies or other treats for those services. If you would be willing to give a ride to and from the Monticello house that would be great! A low sitting vehicle would be optimal.



Church Council Minutes

Below are the unapproved minutes from the August 14, 2025 Church Council Meeting.

Special EUCC Council Budget/Finances Meeting Minutes 8/14/25

Meeting Members: Jimmy McCormack, Kelly Crawford, Geoff Shinn, Pat Holley, Katie Beardslee, Matt Zschille

Members absent: Layton Beggs, Christy Bock, Matt Roethemeyer

This meeting was called to make some decisions requiring council approval to adjust the budget and gather ideas to reduce expenditures.

New Business

- 1. Cleaning service costs \$500/month. Council approved to cancel the cleaning service and replace with Alyssa Rau cleaning 8 hours/month. Net savings \$350/month or \$4200/yr
- 2. Lawn Care costs \$90/mowing. Continue with lawn care this year but use church members & Pastor Josh to mow and trim. Jimmy McCormack will coordinate and find 2-3 volunteers. Net savings \$1800/yr.
- 3. OCWM & Eden Seminary total costs \$8000/yr . Katie motioned to reduce to \$1500/yr for OCWM and \$500/yr for Eden. Geoff seconded. Motion passed. Net savings \$6000/yr
- 4. FMSC previous budget was \$2000/yr with donations offsetting the budget. Suggested contributions are \$40/volunteer and we usually have 30 volunteers. Suggested to set a new budget amount to \$1200/yr with donations offsetting the budget. Net savings \$800/yr
- 5. Facility use. Women's Noon Optimist is looking for a new place to meet every Wednesday and have some closet space for some small items. Discussion settled on \$35/month. Will need to amend the facility use agreement at the next meeting if the Optimist's agree to the fee. Net increase of \$420/yr
- 6. Patrick Rafferty currently uses our facility for guitar lessons. Jesse Steele will be taking over and wants to continue to use EUCC 3-6:30 PM every Tuesday and wants room to store some instruments with possible expansion of time with increase in student enrollment. Discussion settled on \$100/month. Will need to amend the facility use agreement at the next meeting if Jesse agrees to the fee. Net increase of \$1200/yr.
- 7. Cancelled The Cash-Book Journal ad listing EUCC in the church directory. Net savings of \$144/yr.
- 8. Pastor Sam had an interim contract for \$150/service, mileage, and an hourly rate to do pastoral duties. Council has decided to cancel that contract. Pat will draft a cancellation letter. Average monthly savings of \$281/month or approximately \$3360/yr.
- 9. The property insurance was reviewed and updated on July 23, 2025. Several new and updated items reduced the policy premium for the 4th quarter of 2025. In addition, Pat motioned to remove the earthquake insurance entirely. Kelly seconded. Motion passed. Net savings of \$20,354/yr
- 10. Katie motioned to remove the flood insurance entirely. Geoff seconded. Motion passed. Net savings of \$511/yr.
- 11. Kelly motioned to reduce the umbrella insurance from \$10,000,000 to \$5,000,000. Pat seconded. Motion passed. Net savings of \$754/yr
- 12. Council decided to investigate the possibility or interest of yoking with another congregation for potential cost savings. Pastor Josh will talk to other churches to see if they might be interested. Listed below is in order of priority:
 - Another UCC congregation within 20 miles
 - Presbyterians (or other denominations)
 - Other geographic areas (>40 miles apart)
 - Congregations open to changing worship times
 - Total budget savings or increased revenue totaled a net improvement of \$39,543/yr

The meeting was called to order at 8:03 with an opening prayer by Pastor Josh.

Previous minutes were available for review. Motion for approval of previous minutes made by Matt R. and seconded by Kelly. Council approved.

Treasurer and Financial reports given by Pat Holley. Will file for audit. Pat presented a building use agreement template regarding liability provided by the insurance company. Pat motioned to adopt a Facility Use Agreement designed to fit our needs and allow office staff to sign as needed with individuals/groups wanting to use our facilities. Matt R. seconded. Motion passed. A draft agreement will be written and provided to Council for final approval.

Report of Committees

<u>Buildings and grounds report</u>: During the power outage experienced on Tuesday, 8/19 it was noticed that not all of the emergency exit lights were working. After inspection, the backup batteries are 27 years old. Will check into replacing batteries or the sign.

<u>Audit committee report</u>: None. The June audit didn't happen because Christy Bock was in charge of the committee and she has resigned. Kelly will check with the remaining members of the committee to see if that could be completed.

Rental property: Lydia Shinn has moved in and assumed the utilities. It does have its own trash pickup.

<u>Clothing Closet:</u> The ladies have asked for a frosted glass lampshade to be removed to improve lighting in a certain room.

Stewardship Committee: All is well. Still offering church t-shirts for sale.

CBE report: Hasn't met since the picnic.

Lay Service/ Member Care report: No calls for rides after listing it in the bulletin.

Worship report: All is well. Head Usher report: All is well

Pastor Report with notes from Pastor Joshua Rau

- 1. 23 people attended the first Ignite worship service on 8/23
- 2. Bible study will begin in Sept.

Old Business

- 1. Church insurance review. A meeting with our current provider (UCC Insurance Board) is scheduled for Monday 7/21 at 6:00 PM. A meeting with Church Mutual is scheduled for Wednesday 7/23 for an agent to take pictures and submit a quote.
- 2. Passing of the Peace Several members have commented that it seems awkward in its placement in the service, but want to continue having it. Suggested by Council to keep it in the worship service but move it earlier in the service and have a song/Gloria Patri following to help facilitate getting people back to their seats, minimize the length of time allowed and give the congregation a way to know that the service is continuing on.

- 5. New picture directory. The last one was made in 2016. Council decided to look into making one on our own. Group pictures could be taken on a Sunday morning. Lydia Shinn, Kiera Crawford & Maggie St. John have volunteered to take pictures. More information will be gathered on pricing with November being the target date to start.

New Business

- 1. Accept resignation of Christy Bock Pat moved to accept the resignation of Christy Bock. Matt R. second. Motion passed.
- 2. Membership Committee Matt R. motioned to form a committee to determine active and non-active members based on the by-law definition of an active member. Kelly second. Motion passed. The committee will be Pastor Josh, Debra Hoffmann, Pat Holley and 2 members of the congregation. The committee shall report back to the Council before the September meeting if possible.
- 3. Facility Use Fee Schedule update Updated fee schedule. Final draft will be emailed to Council for final approval.
- 4. Fall congregational meeting- Matt R. motioned to set the Congregational Meeting for Sunday, October 26, 2025 following worship. Kelly second. Motion passed.
