





Previous minutes were available for review. Motion for approval of previous minutes made by Christy and seconded by Matt. Council approved.

Treasurer and Financial reports given by Pat Holley. Will file for audit.

Report of Committees

<u>Buildings and grounds report</u>: Internet is switching from Spectrum to Circle Fiber this week resulting in improved reliability and cost savings.

The east A/C unit has been repaired.

Audit committee report: All is well. Meet again in December

<u>Rental property:</u> Tenant committed to stay until the end of the school year. We are looking for a digital copy of the lease. If not found, it will be retyped so we don't have to use a whited-out copy of the old one for future tenants.

Clothing Closet: Was open on 10/12.

Adopt a Hwy: Received a letter that the program is ending and we can pick up our sign later in October. MODOT thanked us for keeping the highways clean and suggested organizing a cleanup with local groups.

Pastor Report with notes from Pastor Josh Rau:

Pat motioned to use undesignated memorial funds to pay for the costs (~<\$1000) associated with completing the chapel and create a plaque listing those memorials used. Geoff 2nd. Motion passed.

Pat motioned to approve new signage for the church as quoted from Sign Art Studio with adding "Elevator to Sanctuary" under the Lower Level column heading. Geoff 2nd. Motion passed.

Katie motioned to approve purchase of 2 new eternal flames for use in the sanctuary and chapel. Matt Z. 2nd. Motion passed.

Concerns were brought up about certain areas of the church that are not being cleaned as well as expected. Alyssa Rau is willing to do weekly cleaning of the church and fellowship hall as an independent contractor for the same monthly price of \$500 that we are currently getting 2 cleanings per month. Council decided to give the cleaning service notice of the specific items that are lacking for a month or two to see if it improves, then a decision will be made.

PRC Committee report

Chairman Chris Crawford gave the following report, licensure requirements, and initial license granted to Pastor Josh by the Conference.

Council granted permission to the PRC committee to seek input from current staff members in creating complete job descriptions.

Computer Quote

Debra Hoffmann and Mike Cooper discussed computer needs and this quote was recommended to the council. Motion made by Pat to approve purchase of the computer with the option to purchase a 2nd monitor at Debra's discretion. Second by Christy. Motion passed. To be purchased from the General Fund as office equipment.

The copier has had 12 service calls this year already whereas it normally averages 2 per year. It is 10 years old. Options on replacement are forthcoming from Scheffers.

The parsonage range is not working properly. Council was provided a quote from Kelso Sales & Service for a stainless steel electric range and matching microwave that would include a vent and installation at a significant discount to retail price. Pat motioned to approve the quote and purchase from Kelso. Katie 2nd. Motion passed.

Sausage shed setup will be Wed. Nov 6 at 4:00 PM.

Pastor Josh has accepted a job providing chaplaincy work for Providence House Hospice a couple hours a week as needed. He will not provide it to church members. It will not interfere with work at Emanuel.

Next meeting: Thursday Nov. 14 at 6:00 PM

Meeting adjourned at 9:28 with motion by Geoff, seconded by Christy with the Lord's prayer led by Jimmy.

Congregational Meeting Minutes

Below are the unapproved minutes from the October 20 Congregational Meeting. Minutes will be approved at the next congregational meeting in February.

October Congregational Meeting 10/20/24

Council President, Jimmy McCormack called the meeting to order at 11:15.

Pastor Josh led the congregation in prayer.

Church Council Elections (3 positions to be filled)

Council nominees:

Jimmy McCormack - run for 2nd term Katie Beardslee - run for 2nd term Kelly Crawford Melanie Lutes Ann Fields Shawn Peetz

Jimmy asked for nominees from the floor. There were none, so everyone was instructed to vote. Ballots were collected and counted. Jimmy McCormack, Katie Beardslee and Kelly Crawford were elected.

Christian Board of Education (2 Positions to be filled)

Erica Cooper Karrie Zschille

Jimmy asked for nominees from the floor. There were none, so both nominees were elected.

Budget/Financial

Pat Holley thanked the budget committee for their input on the 2025 budget. Personnel expenses increased due to having a full time pastor and increasing staff pay. Motion to accept the budget was made by Dennis McCormack. Second by Paul Hoffman. Motion passed.

Buildings & Grounds

Matt Roethemeyer thanked Mike Cooper for installing the new phone system and announced we were switching to Circle Fiber for improved service and cost savings. He also thanked Steve Zschille for installing a video doorbell at the archway doors that has a magnetic lock that can be operated from the office. He also thanked Josh Holcomb for electrical work that he performed. The City of Jackson fixed the sidewalk at the NE corner of Ohio and E. Adams.

Parsonage roof - A quote was received from Hunter & Co to replace the entire shingle roof (ca. 2003) and rebuild the back porch decking for \$10,705.74. This can be paid from either the Seabaugh Fund or Dime a Day fund. Motion to approve made by Erica Cooper. 2nd by Emma Brockmire. Motion passed.

Organ repair - Matt explained that the organ has never been cleaned and the Schwimmer valve and reed stop needs fixed. There were 2 options proposed. Motion was made by Shirley McCormack to approve the second option for \$36,549 that would be paid entirely with memorial funds designated from the Patsy Voshage Estate. 2nd by Cathy Sievers. Motion passed.

Matt informed everyone that if they see something around church that needs attention, let him know so he can either fix it or find someone who can. Emma Brockmire asked for someone with a power washer to clean the porch and back wall of the Clothing Closet.

Conference Delegate

Alyssa Rau volunteered as the Conference Delegate for the October 2024 and 2025 meeting. Pastor Josh described delegate responsibilities. No other volunteers were found. Alyssa gave a report on the Conference Meeting. The outdoor ministries was a major topic. Tambo was sold and some of the money was allocated to maintain Camp Mo-Val and Shannondale. Mo-Val is also converting from a year round camp to only May-Oct. Other items on the agenda were tabled because the Conference didn't follow its own by-laws and didn't give enough notice.

Motion to adjourn made by Mark Statler. Second by Paul Hoffmann.

Closed with a prayer by Pastor Josh at 11:48 a.m.
