- Calm, patient, and professional in high-energy environments and crowds
- Experience handling reptiles, amphibians, and invertebrates; biology/zoology or related background a strong asset

- Experience in early childhood development or special needs education preferred
- Confidence working with students of all ages, abilities, and special needs
- Physically capable of lifting 40–50 lbs, crouching, squatting, and remaining active throughout the day
- Deep commitment to equity, respect, and creating safe spaces for everyone
- French fluency a major asset

- Proficiency for social media (TikTok, Instagram) to support outreach and engagement

PROHIBITIONS

Applicants **cannot** be allergic to soy, or shellfish (crustaceans or mollusks)

Applicants must be over the age of 18, with a valid driver's license and a reliable vehicle.

DESCRIPTION OF TASKS

You work under your supervising Outreach Team Lead as well as the General Director, who will also train you. You will be paired with both at various times while training.

- **Weekly Animal Care:**
 - Animal care for our populations in the lab. This includes but is not limited to feeding, husbandry, habitat maintenance, wellness monitoring, and minor medical intervention on invertebrates, reptiles, and amphibians, both native and exotic
 - Maintain ongoing records of animal care, reporting on animal health, and conducting appropriate responses or strategies in real-time
 - Work with the office and director to ensure wellbeing and communication
 - Accountable for cleanup of worksite and maintaining protocol
- **Outreach and In-School Field Trips**
 - Conducting hands-on educational events in person or online
 - Aptitude and ability to talk to and engage large groups including children and adults
 - Passion and drive for early ed, youth education, and special needs education
 - Competency in managing animals while performing an engaging, interesting educational platform
 - Accountability for performance and interactions with our parent, teacher and student customer bases
 - Film and create content for social media purposes (you will not be required to be *in* these, our platform is not human-centric).
