

## CSI SUMMER CAMP CONDUCT CODE

To be read, discussed, and agreed to by the parent and child. The exercise of self-control, self-discipline, and self-direction are essential to a positive College of Staten Island Summer Camp Program experience. As with any program, cooperation and respect for the rights of others are also essential for the sport to meet its goals. To this end, each child must be responsible for his/her behavior and must respect the rights of others.

The following types of behavior by children in the "CSI Summer Camp" Program may lead to disciplinary action:

- 1. Intentionally giving incorrect information to the staff or other children.
- 2. Use of profane or vulgar language or gestures to staff or the other children.
- 3. Theft of "CSI Summer Camp" property or private property of staff or other children.
- 4. The unauthorized throwing of any object, including stones.
- 5. Setting or use of fires with matches or lighters.
- 6. Possession and /or use of any weapon, including any object that can reasonably be considered dangerous.
- 7. Contributing to, encouraging, or engaging in disruptive behavior, including fighting or excess noise.
- 8. Intentional disobedience, disrespect, or insubordination toward staff.
- 9. Entering an area that has been restricted.

Disciplinary action by staff will be done with respect for the child, with emphasis on helping the child develop his/her ability for self-discipline. When a child's behavior creates a risk to the physical health and safety of another child or the staff, the following procedures shall be followed:

- 1. The child is separated from the problem activity or situation.
- 2. A staff member listens to the child and discusses the consequences of further misbehavior.
- 3. Repeated misbehavior will be handled by a telephone conversation or personal conference with the parent.
- 4. The parent, child, and staff will agree to a plan that will improve behavior, or the child will face the possibility of being terminated from the program.
