Cemetery Report

(Contributed by 2nd Lt. Commander Steve White)

Our schedule for January 2016 clean-up days are:

Jan. 9 – Fort Magruder – We have eight dead trees to cut down and one big branch by the right corner roadside grove to clean-up. The berm needs to have the briars and small saplings cleared off with weed-eaters with blades and/or heavy strings. We will haul the roadside debris out by truck. The backside debris will be piled at the two locations where our neighbors persist in using the fort as a dump. I will try to keep the piles less than six feet wide and no more than 25 feet tall. If you, or anyone you know, can use some dry wood please let me know so that, if they have a trailer or truck, we can get rid of the big blocks and not have to haul them to the bonfire site.

Jan. 16 – Cowles-Spencer, Sunnyside & Peach Park Cemeteries – We will do the usual trimming trees, picking up litter, and weed-eating tall weeds at Cowles-Spencer and Sunnyside. Peach Park will be mulching the walkway and around the David Ware Memorial bench.

Jan. 23 – (possibly) Old Hockaday and Timberlake Cemeteries – General cleanup. Timberlake is on Robert White's property. Both are in New Kent County. Also in New Kent, the fencing of the Robert Timberlake Cemetery off of Polish Town Road will be scheduled for February or March whenever the owner will allow. I will work on that after hunting season.

The start time is 1 p.m. for all clean-ups.

Again, thank you compatriots for allowing me to continue as your 2nd Lieutenant in charge of Cemetery Projects. Your assistance is invaluable to honoring our ancestors thru preservation and restoration of burial sites.
