March Guest Speaker

John J. Fox III **Author**

"The **Confederate** Alamo - Fort Gregg"



We welcome John Fox this month to speak about the 'Assault on Fort Gregg - April 2, 1865'. It is an amazing story of stubborn heroism.

6000 massed Union troops under Gen. Gibbons attacked the 240 Confederate defenders of Ft. Gregg in the early afternoon of April 2. Gen. Lee needed them to buy him 2 hours to form his retreat. They lost 86% of their 240 men killed & wounded while killing and wounding some 700 of the Union attackers. Only 30 unwounded CSA troops remained to surrender. They bought Lee his precious time.

John J Fox III grew up in Richmond, Virginia. He graduated from Washington & Lee University with a U.S. history degree. After school he served on active duty in the U.S. Army for seven years as an armor officer and aviator. He belongs to the Museum of the Confederacy, the Civil War Preservation Trust and is a member and past commander of Turner Ashby Camp #1567. Sons of Confederate Veterans.

Letter from Julian Burnett of Brunswick to Governor Joseph E. Brown of Georgia SC01326, Special Collections Research Center, Swem Library, College of William and Mary

Brunswick Ga Feb 16th

To / 1862

His Exellency Joseph E Brown

Dr Sir

The County Officers

of this County Glynn, that is the Sheriff, The Clerk of the Sup & Inf Courts, Ordinary, & Surveyor, have requested to ascertain if they will be subject to a draft to make up the numbers of troops Georgia is requested to furnish, if the number is not made up by volunteers by the time specified in your proclamation, in case they are subject to resign their offices and volunteer. You will please enlighten me on the subject as I am unable to inform them correctly on the subject. and they wish to know in time to avoid a draft.

I am Very Respectly Your Obt Svt Julian M Burnett J. I C

(ed: Certain job classifications were exempt from the draft. Also, at this early date, men older than 35 were exempt. Mr. Burnett seeks a note from the Governor regarding the draft status of these County Officers. These men did not want to be drafted. They would prefer to volunteer for a specific company or command, and not trust where a draft might place them, if they are no longer exempt. Given a choice they would prefer to volunteer for artillery or cavalry versus being in the infantry.)

(ed: We contacted Jay Gaidmore of Swem Special Collections and advised that this letter was available for purchase. He was able to acquire in January, 2018, and the James City Cavalry assisted with the purchase.)






