Chris Kolakowski

"The Battle of Stones River"

It is our pleasure to have Mr. Kolakowski return to present: Stones River - The defense that prevented the annihilation of the Union Army of the Cumberland.



Christopher L. Kolakowski was born and raised in Fredericksburg, Va. He received his BA in History and Mass Communications from Emory & Henry College, and his MA in Public History from the State University of New York at Albany.

Chris has spent his career interpreting and preserving American military history with the National Park Service, New York State government, the Rensselaer County (NY) Historical Society, the Civil War Preservation Trust, Kentucky State Parks, and the U.S. Army. He has published two books with the History Press: The Civil War at Perryville: Battling For the Bluegrass and The Stones River and Tullahoma Campaign: This Army Does Not Retreat. In September 2016, the U.S. Army published his volume on the 1862 Virginia Campaigns as part of its sesquicentennial series on the Civil War. He is a contributor to the Emerging Civil War Blog, and his study of the 1941-42 Philippine Campaign titled Last Stand on Bataan was released by McFarland in late February 2016.

Chris came to Norfolk having served as Director of the General George Patton Museum and Center of Leadership in Fort Knox, KY from 2009 to 2013. He became the MacArthur Memorial Director on September 16, 2013.

The Swem Library & the James City Cavalry

Growing the Archive of Southern History & History of the WBTS in Tidewater

In 2016 our Camp began a long range effort to assist the Archives of the Swem Library at the College of William and Mary to add 'Southern' items to their collection. Our focus are the years from 1850 to 1875. These items could be books, manuscripts, broadsides, newspapers, monies, bonds, and a variety of other items. However, the main item would be letters. Most would be Confederate and Southern letters but quite often an excellent Union letter of happenings on the Peninsula could also be quite descriptive of what the local Virginians were enduring during the WBTS and Reconstruction.

Our initial donations were a copy of Order #11 which was issued by the Union commander at Fort Magruder during the occupation of Williamsburg. It 'prohibited the galloping or fast driving of horses' within the city. We will print the text of this order in a later issue. We also gave the library a 'first edition' of All Afire to Fight – The Civil War's Ninth Texas Cavalry by Martha Crabb for addition to their regimental histories.

Later we provided copies of Lee's Tigers – The Louisiana Infantry in the Army of Northern Virginia and a copy of Heath Lee's Winnie Davis – Daughter of the Lost Cause.

In 2017 we provided monies to assist with the acquisition of a Yorktown letter from Pvt. Thomas Head of the 6th Georgia Infantry and another from [Pvt] Bumgarner, also from Yorktown. The Thomas Head letter was published in our August, 2016, *Picket Lines*.

When we toured the Swem Archive, in July of 2017, Mr. Jay Gaidmore and his staff had laid out a wonderful selection of Confederate and Southern items from their collection for our viewing. General Order #11, the [Pvt.] Bumgarner letter and the Pvt. Thomas Head letter were all out for our viewing. (see photo and article in our August, 2017 issue)

I have just transcribed three new letters the Archive has just acquired. We are assisting with the purchase of one, we gave Jay the lead on a second from the Yorktown area, and he found a very nice item from Suffolk.

In the next few months I will share these transcriptions with you so that you will be aware of the historical preservation efforts of your Camp. Please go back to the August, 2016, *Picket Lines* and read the words of young Thomas Head. (www.jamescitycavalry.org at Picket Lines tab)









