

SLHWA Cross-Connection Control Plan Communication 1

Dear Association Member

In accordance with the California Safe Drinking Water Act and the State Water Resources Control Board's Cross-Connection Control Policy Handbook (CCCPH), effective July 1, 2025. **Shaver Lake Heights Water Association (SLHWA)** has established a Cross Connection Control Program to protect the public water supply from contamination due to backflow. As stated in CCCPH section 3.1.3(a),

"A PWS (Public Water System) must protect the public water supply through implementation and enforcement of a cross-connection control program."

This policy applies to all members and service connections within the SLHWA service area. The cost for inspections will be \$100 per member. This cost will include initial inspection and 2-HBVBs (hose bib backflow prevention devices) to existing hose bibs.

SLHWA has contracted with Water Connection Inc (a certified cross-connection specialist) to inspect and if necessary to install and repair any unmitigated hazards.

If you do not take appropriate action, SLHWA may be required to disconnect your water service as of June 1, 2026.
