- ♥ Joy and Excitement - Golden Retrievers are naturally cheerful, expressing their happiness through wagging tails, bright eyes, and playful antics.
- ♥ Loyalty and Affection - Goldens form strong bonds and love to be close to their favorite people.
- ♥ Empathy and Sensitivity - Golden Retrievers sense when their owners are upset and needing comfort..
- ♥ Playfulness and Curiosity - With a playful spirit that lasts throughout their lives, Goldens approach the world with curiosity and a sense of adventure.
- ♥ Trust and Connection - Golden Retrievers thrive on connection and need to feel secure within their families. Building a bond of trust with them creates a relationship filled with mutual love and respect.
- ♥ Emotional Needs - Goldens need regular exercise, mental stimulation, and, most importantly, companionship. A Golden left alone for long periods can become lonely and anxious, leading to behavioral issues. Ensuring that they feel loved, secure, and part of the family is essential for their emotional well-being.

NOTE: According to the East Valley Animal Hospital, dogs can experience five core emotions that we humans experience—fear, anger, disgust, joy and sadness. They can also feel more nuanced emotions like excitement, distress, contentment, anxiety, shyness, anticipation and even love. Because a dog's emotional maturity correlates to that of a two-year-old child, they aren't capable of feelings that develop after this age, including shame, guilt, pride or contempt.

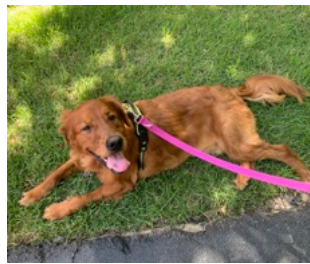

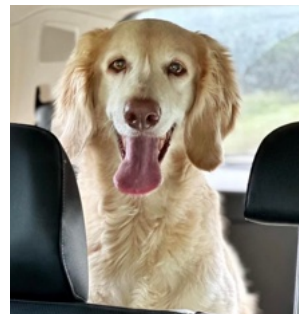

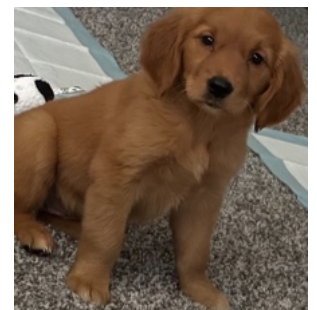
