
It's Time for the 2025 Giving Tree!

Goldens 901 is thrilled to have Jody Fisher as our volunteer foster coordinator. The foster coordinator plays a vital role in ensuring that each Golden Retriever who comes into our rescue is placed with a foster home that is truly the right fit for both the dog and the foster family. Using the information gathered from foster applications, Jody works to make thoughtful matches that set everyone up for success.



When new foster applications are received, Jody conducts a vet check to confirm that any current or recent pets are/were kept up to date on essential vaccinations. Once that step is complete, Jody contacts the applicant to discuss their preferences- including age, gender, and energy level- and answer any questions. Some fosters love seniors, while others enjoy the excitement of puppies, so these conversations help us match the Goldens to the best possible foster homes.

Opening your heart and home to a foster makes an incredible impact. For those unable to commit to a longer foster placement, we also offer “vacation fostering.” Vacation fosters step in when a primary foster is out of town. Every contribution helps us continue our mission of giving these wonderful Goldens the care and love they deserve to set them up to succeed when they get adopted. Holiday Pet Safety

Many holiday foods, plants, and decorations are toxic to pets. Make sure you prevent access to dangerous foods, plants, ornaments, electrical cords, and décor. Develop a plan to keep your precious Goldens calm during guests and routine changes. Think ahead and prepare for emergencies: update tags/microchips and have vet contacts handy.

Beware of These Potential Pet Hazards!

Fatty foods	Cause vomiting, diarrhea, and pancreatitis.
Chocolate	Toxic to dogs and cats; can cause tremors, seizures, heart issues.
Grapes & raisins	Can trigger kidney failure.
Sugar-free candy/gum (xylitol)	Causes dangerous drops in blood sugar and liver failure in dogs.
Onions & garlic	Damage red blood cells; cause anemia (especially in cats).
Meat bones (cooked)	Splinter, cause blockages or cuts; raw bones may carry bacteria.
Alcohol	Even small amounts can cause seizures, coma, or death.
Poinsettias	Mild stomach upset and irritation.
Lilies	Extremely toxic to cats; cause kidney failure.
Holly	Causes vomiting, diarrhea, drooling, and mouth injuries.
Mistletoe	Can cause stomach upset; large amounts may cause seizures or death.
Candles	Fire/burn risk for curious pets.
Christmas trees	Falling trees, climbing cats, toxic water, ornament hazards.
Ornaments & snow globes	Choking, cutting injuries, toxic chemicals.
Tinsel, string, ribbons	Cause dangerous intestinal blockages.
Electrical cords	Risk of burns, electrocution, seizures.
Houseguests	Stress, access to bags/meds, open doors, routine disruption.
Heaters & warming devices	Burn and fire hazards; tipping risks.
Fireplaces	Ash ingestion and wood obstruction risks.
Cleaning supplies	Toxic chemicals, even natural cleaners can irritate the stomach.
Ice melts	Cause paw burns, stomach upset, electrolyte issues.
Antifreeze	Highly toxic; even a drop can be fatal.
