Rosanne is a 70ft Narrowboat purpose built for youth groups based at Leighton Buzzard on the Grand Union Canal

You can hire Rosanne for weekends, mid-week or full weeks cruises from late March to early November

ON BOARD

Rosanne is fully equipped for cruising all you need is a sleeping bag and clothes, and food for your cruise.

Rosanne comes fully equipped for your cruise, it can take thirteen on board including the skipper. Sleeping is arranged in three main cabins with beds/bunks for ten, the galley converts to two berths and there is a skipper's cabin at the rear,

ROSANNE

Rosanne is a cruiser-style narrowboat (not a barge or longboat, so you can leave the Viking hats at home!). She is 70 feet long and 7 feet wide. This is the maximum size that will pass through all the locks on the extensive English canal system. Many locks will however take two narrowboats the size of Rosanne side by side.

FAMILIARISATION

Before using Rosanne, the skipper will require training before being allowed to take charge of the boat. Bromley Youth Trust provides potential skippers a training day when they will be familiarised with the how the boat systems operate and gain some practical experience on handling the boat, including operating locks and dealing with emergencies. Bromley Youth Trust are also able to provide skippers if users require such a service.

CANAL LIFE

There is plenty to do, particularly operating locks and mooring temporarily before entering. There are meals to be prepared and the boat to be kept clean and tidy. When the boat is moored there are towpath walks and places to visit.

Canal cruising is fun and there are educational and social benefits to be gained from taking a group of young people away to an environment that's completely different from what they're used to every day. The pace of life on the canal is relaxed and a trip on Rosanne allows young people to experience what it is like to live together, and be empowered with responsibility.

Whether your trip is long or short, young people attending will learn to work together as a team whether it is operating locks, or onboard activities.
