Jews Hebrews and Semites

Definition – **Jew** or **Jewish people** are members of an <u>ethnoreligious group</u> and a <u>nation</u> originating from the <u>Israelites</u> and <u>Hebrews</u> of historical <u>Israel and Judah</u>. Jewish ethnicity, nationhood, and religion are strongly interrelated, as <u>Judaism</u> is the <u>ethnic religion</u> of the Jewish people, although its observance varies from strict to none. - Wikipedia

Definition – *Hebrews* and *Hebrew people* are mostly taken as synonymous with the <u>Semitic-speaking Israelites</u>, especially in the pre-monarchic period when they were still <u>nomadic</u>. However, in some instances it may also be used in a wider sense, referring to the <u>Phoenicians</u>, or to other ancient groups, such as the group known as <u>Shasu of Yhw</u> on the eve of the <u>Bronze Age</u> <u>collapse</u>, which, although not an <u>ethnonym</u>, appears 34 times within 32 verses of the <u>Hebrew Bible</u>. - Wikipedia

Hebrew, any member of an ancient nomadic northern Semitic people some of whom were the ancestors of the <u>Jews</u>.

Definition – <u>Semites</u> or <u>Semitic</u> people are members of any of a number of ancient nomadic peoples who spoke related languages and lived in southwestern Asia including the Akkadians, Phoenicians, Hebrews, and Arabs and the descendants of these peoples.
