Background

For most of us born since WWII, we are experiencing an unprecedented period of stress and seeming uncertainty. COVID-19 disease has disrupted the way we had become accustomed to living in every way. Our most common activities and rituals pose risks of serious disease or even death. As of this writing, there have been more than two hundred and forty-five million cases of confirmed infection and five million deaths. Each of us knows someone who has been made sick by this infection, including members of our congregation, and some of us know people who have died. And new varieties of the virus keep appearing.

Questions to Consider

- 1. How can we say better times are ahead?
- 2. How has the pandemic most affected your daily life? How has it most affected your spiritual life? How has it most affected your personal life?
- 3. COVID-19 disease will not be disappearing. It is not going away. We will likely go from a pandemic to endemic conditions. Endemic is a term that indicates a continuous low to moderate level of infection in specific populations of people, but not worldwide infection. Is that better times? Explain.
- 4. What are some positive outcomes of the pandemic?
- 5. The verses above assure us that God is with us, even in troubles and trials. Do they strengthen you or not? Discuss.
