

2024 TOUR DIRECTIONS

START: From Woodstown Diner

Turn left out of the parking lot onto Maple Court

Follow to stop sign and make right onto Lincoln Ave.

Then make Rt. onto Dickinson St.

Follow to stop sign and make Right onto South Main Street

Go straight through the light onto North Main St.

Follow North Main St. around the sharp bend. You will see the Quaker Meeting house on the left.

Make the 3rd Left past the Quaker Meeting house onto Auburn Road.

Follow Auburn Road all the way to the 4 Way Stop. Make a Left at the 4 Way Stop onto Kings Hwy.

Follow Kings Hwy to the light, go Straight through light to stay on Kings Hwy.

Make Right onto Seabrook Road

Follow Seabrook Road to end and make a Left onto Rt. 540 (Pointers Auburn Road).

Merge Right onto Route 45 at Salem Hospital

Follow Route 45 into Salem.

Go straight through first light. At second light turn Right onto Broadway.

Continue on Broadway and turn Right at the light onto Front Street.

Follow Front Street over the Bridge. Front Street becomes Route 49.

Follow Route 49 towards Pennsville, past the Marina.

Turn Left onto Lighthouse Road.

When you reach the bend Finns Point Lighthouse, merge Left onto Fort Mott Road.

Follow Fort Mott Road to the Park Entrance, turn Right into the Park. (2nd Right is Park Entrance).

We will be leaving Fort Mott via Fort Mott Road.

Turn Right onto Lighthouse Road when you reach the bend at Finns Point Lighthouse.

Follow Lighthouse Road to end and turn Right onto Route 49.

Follow Route 49 past the marina and over the Salem Bridge.

Bear to your Right going over the bridge and onto Front Street.

Go Straight through the light on Front Street.

Turn Right onto Grieves Parkway

Turn Left onto Tilbury Road

Turn Right onto Sinnickson Landing Road (Look for the Coastal Heritage Tour Sign)

Turn Right onto Fort Elfsborg Road.

Bear to the Left to stay on Fort Elfsborg Road

Stay to the Left again to stay on Fort Elfsborg Road.

Turn Left onto Salem-Hancock's Bridge Road.

Make quick Right onto Quinton-Hancock's Bridge Road

Turn Left onto Route 49

Hudock's Custard Stand will be on your Right.

Places of Note Along the Tour

Friends (Quaker) Meetinghouse-Woodstown, NJ

Building dated 1785.\nFrom "Old Meeting Houses" by J. Russell Hayes. "Old-time peacefulness and love and charm" Pilesgrove, NJ.\nPilesgrove Monthly Meeting was established in 1794 by Salem Quarterly Meeting out of Salem Monthly Meeting. At the time of the Hicksite Separation of 1827, the meeting split into Hicksite and Orthodox branches. Pilesgrove Monthly Meeting (Orthodox) was discontinued in 1830. In 1928, Salem Quarterly Meeting approved the dissolution of Pilesgrove Monthly Meeting (Hicksite). Its two preparative meetings were then established as Mullica Hill Monthly Meeting and Woodstown Monthly Meeting.



First Presbyterian Church of Salem, NJ

Located on one of the two original streets laid out in 1685 near the heart of downtown Salem, First Presbyterian Church of Salem was built in 1856 by architect John McArthur, designer of City Hall in Philadelphia. With its imposing 165-foot steeple, the church is a fixture of the Salem skyline and a prominent landmark in the downtown historic district.

The Trust grant helped fund the restoration of the exterior of the church, including the stained glass windows, and historic landscape of the forecourt, including the iron fence.



Finn's Point Lighthouse

c. 1876 wrought iron lighthouse is listed on the National Registry of Historic Places. Originally constructed in Buffalo, New York and then moved here by train and mule-wagon, this unusual wrought-iron, open-frame, lighthouse was built at a cost of \$1,200 in 1876. Standing 115 feet tall, it featured a 24-inch range lens with double wick burner and kerosene vapor lamp emitting 150,000 candlepower. Close by is Fort Mott State Park, a 104-acre waterfront park with buildings and gun emplacements from the Spanish - American War. It's listed on the National Register of Historic Places.
