Job Summary:

The Community Child & Youth Network (CCYN) Facilitator is responsible for supporting the children and youth programs/services in the 16 Community Houses within the Ottawa Coalition of Community Houses. This position works closely with the Coalition Coordinator and the Coalition Facilitator to assess and respond to ongoing needs and emerging trends in community-based programs. In addition, the CCYN Facilitator will build collaborative relationships with the partnering Community House staff.

Community Child & Youth Network

The CCYN links frontline staff with opportunities to share best practices, identify and collaborate on trends in the community, build skills through professional development opportunities and increase knowledge through the Speakers Series.

Support Frontline Staff

Each Community House offers a variety of child & youth programs/services designed specific to their community. Staff range from senior Child & Youth Workers to short term program assistants.

- Experience with developing, implementing and evaluating children and youth programs
- Knowledge of social service agencies, mental health services and systems navigation in Ottawa preferred
- Lived experience of the Black, Indigenous, People of Colour communities In Ottawa is preferred
- Strong oral and written communication skills
- Bilingualism preferred, other languages; Arabic, Lingala, Creole or other languages commonly spoken among Black communities in Ottawa will be considered an asset
