## Top Ten Books (Levels 1-12)

The reading order of these books should be done sequentially through level 4. These are foundational texts that serve to give faith the proper starting and return point. Levels 5-11 are all on the same level of difficulty but contain different areas of emphasis. Further, there are non-theological and secular texts on the list that all Christians should have some degree of familiarity. Crucial to your reading of these books is the warning that you do not supplant your daily reading of the Bible with books about the Bible or Christianity. These books are to be a help in reading the Scripture, and also help in how to proclaim the gospel message in all of its power. "Theology is like a map. Merely learning and thinking about the Christian doctrines, if you stop there, is less real and less exciting than the sort of thing my friend got in the desert (a personal experience of God). Doctrines are not God: they are only a kind of map. But that map is based on the experience of hundreds of people who really were in touch with God--experiences compared with which many thrills of pious feelings you and I are likely to get on our own are very elementary and very confused. And secondly if you want to get any further you must use the map."— C.S. Lewis.

There are two final points, perhaps warnings, you must always hearken back to when reading these books. First, the purpose of this quest is truth, not knowledge. "But knowledge puffs up" (1 Corinthians 8:1). Seek truth first and always. The genuine seeking of truth will always, although sometimes in a roundabout way, land you in the arms of Jesus Christ who is the truth incarnate (John 14:6). In this way you will keep gospel humility while learning much. Nothing is more odious to non-Christians than followers of Christ who are obnoxiously smart. Your goal must always be truth and humility, always in that particular order. Luckily for us, an authentic trust in Jesus Christ as your Savior bestows both qualities. However, watch out for Satan's most powerful weapon during your study: pride. "Whenever we find that our religious life is making us feel that we are good - above all, that we are better than someone else - I think we may be sure that we are being acted on, not by God, but by the devil." – CS Lewis

Second, consider your reading of these books a sort of adventure into a far country. It is going to be fun, but also confusing and, at times, a bit scary. As Tolkien wrote of Bilbo Baggins at the beginning of *The Hobbit*, "This is a story of how a

Baggins had an adventure, and found himself doing and saying things altogether unexpected...There are no safe paths in this part of the world. Remember, you are over the Edge of the Wild now, and in for all sorts of fun wherever you go.” So, enjoy this adventure, for it is an adventure that is rooted in a sure and certain future: eternal life with Jesus.

\*I read the books listed in levels 1-4 once a year. “It is a good rule, after reading a new book, never to allow yourself another new one till you have read an old one in between. If that is too much for you, you should at least read one old one to every three new ones.” – C.S. Lewis
