LEST WE FORGET

SEPTEMBER 15, 1963

It was 57 years ago today that the city of Birmingham was shook by the tragic and cruel act of the 16th Street Church bombing. During that time the prominent church served as a base for the SCLC and activist in the city to hold large meetings, plan rallies, and demonstrations in the early 1960's for civil rights. It was for these reasons those who opposed the movement chose to bomb the church that fateful Sunday morning before service on September 15th, 1963. Sadly, the world was forever changed and four families suffered an unimaginable loss. Five beautiful young girls were in the basement at the time of the bombing. Carole Robertson, our own little "Jill" was one of the girls that perished. She along with Denise McNair, Cynthia Wesley, and Addie Mae Collins died. Sarah Collins, Addie Mae's younger sister, survived. With so much unrest in our country now it is even more important to remember this tragedy so we can all work to ensure it is never repeated. Carole Robertson was the daughter of Alpha Robertson, the first Regional Director of the Southeastern Region. Their family was a part of the Birmingham Chapter of Jack and Jill of America, Inc. As an organization, every year since 1964 all chapters of Jack and Jill of America, Inc. honor Carole Robertson with memorial observances during September to highlight those goals of human rights that Carole did not live to enjoy.
