## **Dogs:** Mrs Viv Phillips (Debucher)

I have been breeding Dachshunds since 1972 and Dobermanns since 1982. I joined Nick Frost and Dehra PBGVs in 1985. In that year Ch Fredwell Fiasco was born and I jointly owned and showed him. He became a Champion prior to going to Finland. My first two PBGV Champions were Ch Jomil Zadok and Ch Dehra Lalique both very relevant Hounds in the breed in the UK.

We brought in the first GBGV litter through quarantine in 1989 and we were then the only UK kennel here with the 4 Basset breeds including Basset Fauve de Bretagne.

In 1995, Nick Frost went to the USA and I applied for the Debucher affix, for both PBGVs and GBGVs. I continued to breed Basset Hounds in partnership with Mrs Joan Wells Meacham under the Fredwell affix for several years

I awarded CCs in PBGV for the first time in 1993 and have judged them both here and overseas on many occasions. I judged them at Crufts in 2007 and awarded CCs in Basset Hounds for the first time in 2004 at wkc.

I have bred several PBGV Champions both here and abroad and I won the Hound Group at Crufts with Ch Debucher C'est Ca in 1997.

I have bred many GBGV Champions both here and overseas and for 8 years campaigned Ch/Dutch/Ger/World Ch Debucher le Barbu, winner of the "Winners" show in Amsterdam in 2000. He was also number 7 all breeds in 2001 unusual for a "rare breed".

I judge all the breeds in the UK Hound Breeds at Championship level as well as the Group itself.

Having lived with Basset Hounds for many years, I look forward to judging them here today.

## **Bitches:** Mrs Birte Scheel (Scheels) [Denmark]

I have been in dogs since 1971 when I got my first Basset Hound while still in school. Together with my husband Kresten Scheel, I bred and showed Basset Hounds, Lhasa Apsos and Shelties for many years. Some of our well known Bassets were CH Tal-E-Ho's Tiffany, CH Tal-E-Ho's Smooth Operator, CH Scheel's First Edition ROM, CH Scheel's Riveredge Rubber Duck and CH Scheel's Excalibur.

In 1993 I got my Championship judging license from the Danish Kennel Club/FCI to judge all the Basset breeds and in 2014 I became Danish Kennel Club/FCI All Breed/All-Round Int. Championship Dog Show judge and I am a Breed Specialist judge for Basset Hounds, Shetland Sheepdogs and Lhasa Apsos.

Over the years I have judged both international all breed Kennel Club shows and breed specialties all over Scandinavia, in Germany, Holland, Belgium, England, Ireland, Estonia, Lithuania, Poland, Czech Republic, Ukraine, Spain, Switzerland, U.S.A. Mexico, South Korea, Australia and New Zealand.

We still have one Basset and one Sheltie at home.

#### DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(N.B. The word 'dog' includes both sexes)

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. Monday, 7th October 2019.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) Withdrawal
  - The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.
- (2) Transfer
  - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
  - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
  - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
  - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**OPEN** For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

**BRACE** For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.

BREEDERS For dogs bred by the exhibitor.

**PROGENY** For a dog or bitch accompanied by at least 3 of its registered progeny, having been entered and exhibited in another class. The Dog or Bitch and the progeny need not be registered in the same ownership.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS For dogs, owners and handlers not having won a Challenge Certificate.

#### ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

#### RULES and REGULATIONS

- 1. The Show will open at 9.30 am.
- Dogs will be received at any time after the opening of the show but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 10.30 am.
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. Entry Fees: Members: First Entry per dog £13.50; each subsequent entry with the same dog £1.00. Non-Members: First Entry per dog £15.00; each subsequent entry with the same dog £2.00. Veteran: £6.00 first entry per dog. Not for Competition: £2.00 per dog. Junior Handling: £2.00 per class. Catalogues: £2.00 pre-paid with entries, £2.50 on the day. Advertisements: £5.00 Full page; £3.00 Half page. Membership Subscription: £10.00 Joint; £9.00 Single.
- 6. There is no prize money on offer at this show.
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.

#### 10. Best Puppy in Show

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.

#### 11. Best in Show

Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them <u>nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet</u>
  <u>not to touch the ground when on the move.</u> This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute
  harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/ event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- · When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
   Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

- 17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show
- 18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 19. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
- 20. Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is requested to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed event within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
- 21. Should the Judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement the committee reserve to themselves the right of appointing another judge to fulfill his/her duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entrance fee can be returned.
- 22. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time whilst at the licensed venue including its environs, car park and caravan parks and approaches.
- 23. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
- 24. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

#### HEALTH AND SAFETY DECLARATION

Exhibitors and spectators are reminded that, just as the Basset Hound Club has a responsibility to ensure the health and safety of all those attending their event, exhibitors show at their own risk if conditions are not ideal and have a duty and responsibility for their own safety. They are therefore expected to take great care to avoid guide ropes, uneven surfaces and other hazards, which are inevitable and integral elements of a dog show. Those bringing and using portable items of equipment such as folding chairs, trolleys, cages, and grooming tables also have a responsibility to ensure that their tools, equipment and collapsible furniture is used and erected safely and does not constitute a hazard to others. Exhibitors are also reminded that they should wear appropriate clothing and footwear for the prevailing conditions on the site.
