Dear TRH Residents,

On April 5th, and 6th, the state survey team came to evaluate our RCF ministry. They looked at our caregiving program, our meal service, and the facilities.

The major area of concern that they found was the condition of our facilities. Particular concerns are siding and roofing of the octaplexes, the need for kitchen updates including new flooring and shelving, and replacing the worn wood in the walkways. Our maintenance men are working very hard on the long list of repairs and fix-ups. We are seeking bids on the work that we cannot do ourselves. Volunteers are very welcome to help us!

It was our intention to complete these major projects as donations came in for the **900 for 90** campaign, however, we are accelerating the work. Please keep our staff in prayer as they tackle all these items. And pray that we have financial support (we need at least \$100,000) to complete these things in a timely manner. Survey requires that we have an active plan of completion and a timeline to go with it.
