RE: TRH Response to Governor Brown's Two-Week Freeze

Greetings to all of you. These are exciting days to live in. Thanksgiving time calls for us to be thankful and I am thankful for creation. The sun rises and falls every day. God made this event a constant rhythm for each of us. The year 2020 has been an interesting year to say the least. Complex issues are seemingly before us at every turn. Just when we think "Okay, now I am getting used to this..." something else happens.

As you all probably know Oregon Governor Kate Brown has placed a two-week freeze on activities in many areas to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 throughout the state. Recently, many places of Oregon have experienced surges in positive cases and Marion County (where Turner Retirement Homes is located) is no exception. Governor Brown also said that "higher risk regions will likely face longer restrictions."

The two-week moratorium shares many of the same restrictions as Governor Brown's previous order from this past March. Effective November 17 through December 2 TRH will be under the two-week freeze that has been suggested. Our restrictions will be:

- Office closed to public
- Essential staff will report to work as scheduled
- Resident Care Facility (RCF) closed to inside visitation from family members and the general public
- The dining hall is closed until further notice to RCF family style meals
- RCF residents will be served meals in their apartments by care staff
- All visitors report to the Care Station to be screened before visiting an RCF resident on the porch
- No activities, Bible studies or church services for the RCF residents
- RCF residents can leave for visits to family homes but must abide by a two-week quarantine upon return and to be tested for COVID 48 hours before at resident expense. Cost for meal delivery will be added to bill.
- All office staff will continue working on a pre-arranged schedule
- The practices of social distancing, wearing masks and proper handwashing all still occur as usual

Please know that we are doing our utmost to be obedient to government authorities, safeguard the health of RCF residents by mitigating the spread of the virus and wanting to allow for greater freedom to the residents. We will do our best and trust God for the strength to live our lives for His glory.
