


#### Massachusetts Maternity Hospitals and Hospitals with Midwife Births




#### **Pregnancy and Risk Stratification** There is no uniformly utilized definition of a high risk pregnancy. CDC estimates that in 2013, 83% of first time mothers were at low risk for a cesarean birth.1 The NIH lists several high risk factors affecting 2-10% of pregnancies.2 Risk More than half of pregnant women in the US Pregnancies are overweight or obese, which increases their risk,3 Low-It is reasonable to assume that the majority of women are low-moderate Moderate Risk →C AMERICAN COLLEGE of NURSE-MIDWIVES Sources in Notes View.








