

# **Welcome Packet**

We are excited that you chose us for your flight training! If you have not already submitted the following items to your instructor, please be sure to bring them with you the next time you fly with us:

- Passport OR birth certificate
- Driver's license/government issued ID

Please review Page 3 for information on getting your FAA medical. We recommend that you set up an appointment to get a 3rd class medical as soon as possible. Or, if you plan on making this a career, you can get a 1st or 2nd class.

Please begin to familiarize yourself with our scheduling system, Flight Circle. This is where you will find information about aircraft maintenance, instructor and aircraft availability, your training syllabus progress, existing reservation status, and view your complete billing ledger.

# Required items:

- Headset
  - The school has headsets that you may use, however, investing in your own is always the best option.
  - We recommend starting off with David Clarks. David Clarks will run you about \$350. They are dependable and will last you a long time.
  - If you want a nice pair with the noise canceling feature, we recommend Bose.
- Kneeboard
  - The average cost is anywhere from \$20-\$80, and you can find them on Sportys.com. You may choose to purchase a small tablet, but it is not required.
- Logbook
  - We have logbooks for sale at the school for you to purchase.
- Foreflight
  - Navigational/flight planning app. Subscription prices vary and can be used on Apple products. Investing in and learning how to utilize the



application early is a good idea, as it will likely be your primary source of planning when you become a pilot.

## FAR/AIM

• You can get the FAR/AIM app, which updates automatically every year, on your iPad for \$10. Hard copy versions will be \$15-\$20 on Amazon. This is the "pilot bible" and updated copies annually are a must.

## **Ground School**

We recommend that you choose a good home study course to prepare for the written exam and checkride. There will be plenty of opportunities to cover ground school material with your instructor, but a home study course saves you a significant amount of time and money! We use and highly recommend the King School program.

#### Written exam

The written exam, also called the Knowledge Test, is part of the certification process. Written exams can be taken at any testing location. When you get to this stage in your training, you will go to <u>faa.psiexams.com</u> and set up an account. You will need your FTN (flight training number) in order to set up an account, which your flight instructor will help you obtain when you apply for your student pilot certificate.

The cost of your written exam will be \$175, and you can take it at Skywarrior, AMS, or Trident/Pray Aviation. If you score a 90% or above, Pensacola Air will credit the amount for the exam to your flight training account!

If you military you can take the written exam for FREE at Hurlburt Education Center on Tuesdays when they are scheduled; you have your own access to the base.

## Instructor

It is important for your flight training journey that you and your instructor are a good match. If for any reason you feel as if it is not working out with you and your instructor

## **Student Renter's Insurance**

All Private Pilot students must have a renter's insurance policy in place with a minimum of \$25,000 non-owned hull value / physical damage to aircraft coverage. There are multiple providers to choose from, and you may contact your instructor or Pensacola Air staff for help if needed.



Certified pilots who are pursuing advanced ratings/certificates must have a policy with a minimum of at least \$50,000 non-owned hull value / physical damage to aircraft coverage.
