Provide these military documents to your CFI for validation to ensure accurate recordkeeping for your checkride preparation

Medical Examinations

What Qualifies:

- DD Form 2992, Medical Recommendation for Flying Duty With the Following Requirements:
 - ✓ Box 11.a Checked: CLEARED AFTER FLIGHT DUTY MEDICAL EXAMINATION
 - ✓ Box 11.c: EXPIRATION DATE (Not to exceed 12 mos)
 - ✓ Box 13: No Disgualifying Remarks for Pilot Flight Status
 - ✓ Box 14: Medical Professional Signature
 - ✓ Box 15: Member Certification

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DD Form 2808, Report of Medical Examination

OUALIFIED FO TING CLASS I | II | III WITH STAMP CERTIFYING QUALIFICATION FOR PILOT FLIGHT STATUS

✓ Expiration date of Flight Status must be documented

All Military Flight Physicals = 12 Month Duration

Ref: 14 CFR 61.23(b)(11) When a military pilot of the U.S. Armed Forces can show evidence of an up-to-date medical examination authorizing pilot flight status issued by the U.S. Armed **Forces**

Flight Hours

What Qualifies (towards Dual Received):

Any flight training experience when serving as a required crewmember (ie Student Pilot, SNA, CSO, etc)

With the Following Requirements:

- ✓ Manipulator of Flight Controls (ie T-6, right seat T-1, etc)
- ✓ Produce Logbook Entries with the following info:
 - Military Instructor Pilot Name
 - Aircraft ID / Tail Number
 - Date of Flight
 - **Total Flight Time Duration**
 - Conditions of Flight (Day, Night, etc)

Ref: 14 CFR § 61.41(a) A person may credit flight training toward the requirements of a pilot certificate or rating issued under this part, if that person received the training from a flight instructor of an Armed Force in a program for training military pilots of the United States; or foreign contracting State to the Convention on International Civil Aviation.
