From the Garden to the Kingdom: Rediscovering God's Original Design

Theme Verse

"The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it." — Genesis 2:15 (NIV)

Day 1: It All Belongs to the King

Scripture Reading

Psalms 24:1–2

"The earth is the LORD's, and everything in it..."

Devotional

Before God ever asked Adam to cultivate the Garden, He established something that has never changed: ownership. Adam was placed in the Garden with authority, but not ownership. He was entrusted with responsibility over something that already belonged to God.

That same truth applies to us today. Our time, relationships, careers, gifts, finances, influence, and even our very lives are not possessions to control—they are gifts to steward. Stewardship begins when we recognize that everything belongs to the King.

Living as a steward changes our perspective. Instead of asking, "What do I want?" we begin asking, "Lord, what do You desire?" Every decision becomes an act of worship because we are managing what belongs to Someone else.

The freedom found in stewardship is remarkable. We no longer carry the burden of ownership because the Owner is faithful. Our responsibility is simply to be faithful with what He has entrusted to us.

Reflect

- What areas of your life have you treated as your own instead of God's?
- How would your decisions change if you truly believed everything belongs to Him?

Prayer

Father, remind me that everything I have belongs to You. Help me surrender every area of my life into Your hands and teach me to live as a faithful steward rather than an owner. May my life honor the One who has entrusted so much to my care. In Jesus' name, Amen.

What Is God Saying to Me Today?

Day 2: Stewardship Is Worship

Scripture Reading

Colossians 3:23–24

Devotional

Genesis tells us that Adam was placed in the Garden "to work it and take care of it." The Hebrew word *‘ābad* means more than labor—it also means to serve and worship through faithful service. The word *shāmar* means to guard, preserve, and faithfully watch over what has been entrusted.

This means Adam's first assignment wasn't merely gardening; it was worship through stewardship.

Sometimes we limit worship to songs we sing on Sunday, but Scripture paints a much bigger picture. Worship happens every time we faithfully care for what God has entrusted to us. We worship by honoring our commitments, caring for our families, using our gifts with integrity, and serving others with excellence.

Every ordinary task becomes sacred when it is done for the King.

Reflect

- How can your daily responsibilities become acts of worship?
- What has God asked you to faithfully cultivate and protect?

Prayer

Lord, help me see that worship extends beyond music and gatherings. Teach me to worship You through my work, my service, and my daily faithfulness. Let every responsibility become an opportunity to honor You. Amen.

What Is God Saying to Me Today?

Day 3: Recognize the King

Scripture Reading

Matthew 21:1–11

Devotional

Before Jesus cleansed the Temple, challenged the religious leaders, or told a single parable, Matthew wanted us to see one thing first:

The King had arrived.

Jesus entered Jerusalem in humility, fulfilling prophecy and revealing Himself before inspecting the stewardship of His people. That order is significant.

Recognition always comes before responsibility.

When we truly recognize Jesus as King, surrender becomes a natural response. We stop negotiating with Him and begin trusting Him. Stewardship is no longer something we have to do—it becomes the joyful expression of knowing who He is.

Every area of our lives begins with this question:

Have I truly recognized the King?

Reflect

- Is Jesus simply your Savior, or is He truly the King of every area of your life?
- What areas are still resisting His authority?

Prayer

Jesus, I acknowledge You as my King. Rule over my heart, my thoughts, my plans, and my future. Help me surrender every area of my life to Your loving authority. Amen.

What Is God Saying to Me Today?

Day 4: Fruit Over Appearance

Scripture Reading

John 15:4–8

Devotional

When Jesus approached the fig tree, it was full of leaves but produced no fruit. It looked healthy, but it failed to fulfill its purpose.

It's possible to look spiritually mature while producing very little Kingdom fruit.

God isn't impressed by appearances. He isn't measuring how busy we are or how much we know. He's looking for lives that bear the fruit of Christ—love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

Fruit is the visible evidence of an inward relationship with Jesus.

When we remain connected to Him, fruit naturally follows.

Reflect

- Are there areas where your life has more "leaves" than fruit?
- What fruit is God inviting you to cultivate?

Prayer

Father, forgive me for the times I've focused more on appearance than transformation. Produce genuine fruit in my life so others encounter Jesus through me. Amen.

What Is God Saying to Me Today?

Day 5: Manifest the Person of Christ

Scripture Reading

Galatians 4:19

Devotional

The ultimate goal of stewardship is not simply managing God's gifts well.

It is allowing the Person of Jesus Christ to be formed within us until He is visible through us.

This is why the journey of discipleship matters:

Inspiration → Revelation → Transformation → Manifestation.

God inspires us through His Son.

He reveals truth through His Spirit.

He transforms us through obedience.

Then He manifests Christ through our lives.

When people encounter us, they should increasingly encounter Jesus.

That is the purpose of Kingdom stewardship.

Reflect

- If someone observed your life this week, what would they learn about Jesus?
- Which of the Five P's—Presence, Purpose, Prompting, Possessions, or Person—needs your greatest attention?

Prayer

Father, let the Person of Jesus Christ be clearly seen through my life. Shape my character, transform my heart, and make me a faithful steward of everything You have entrusted to me. May my life bring glory to Your Kingdom. In Jesus' name, Amen.

What Is God Saying to Me Today?

Weekly Declaration

Today I choose to live as a faithful steward of God's Kingdom.

Everything I have belongs to the King.

I will faithfully steward His Presence.

I will faithfully pursue His Purpose.

I will faithfully respond to His Prompting.

I will faithfully manage His Possessions.

Until the Person of Jesus Christ is manifested in and through my life.

I choose to move from Inspiration to Revelation to Transformation until Christ is manifested through me.
