

STUDY GUIDE: *SEE AGAIN: From Confusion to Clarity*

OBJECTIVE

This study will help you:

- Understand how clarity comes through renewed thinking
 - Identify where perception may be incorrect
 - Recognize how God uses interruption as preparation
 - Apply biblical truth to walk in clarity and alignment
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CORE TRUTH: *Clarity changes everything*

CORE SCRIPTURE (FULL TEXT)

Acts 9:1–18 (NIV)

“Meanwhile, Saul was still breathing out murderous threats against the Lord’s disciples. He went to the high priest

2 and asked him for letters to the synagogues in Damascus, so that if he found any there who belonged to the Way, whether men or women, he might take them as prisoners to Jerusalem.

3 As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him.

4 He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, ‘Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?’

5 ‘Who are you, Lord?’ Saul asked. ‘I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting,’ he replied.

6 ‘Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do.’

7 The men traveling with Saul stood there speechless; they heard the sound but did not see anyone.

8 Saul got up from the ground, but when he opened his eyes he could see nothing. So they led him by the hand into Damascus.

9 For three days he was blind, and did not eat or drink anything.

17 Then Ananias went to the house and entered it. Placing his hands on Saul, he said, ‘Brother Saul, the Lord—Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you were coming here—has sent me so that you may see again and be filled with the Holy Spirit.’

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18 Immediately, something like scales fell from Saul’s eyes, and he could see again. He got up and was baptized.”

SECTION 1: CONFIDENT BUT MISALIGNED

Focus: Acts 9:1–2

Teaching Insight

- Saul was not confused—he was confident
 - Confidence without clarity leads to misalignment
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Key: *You can be confident and still be wrong—if you lack clarity.*

Reflection

Where in your life are you confident... but may lack clarity?

SECTION 2: THE INTERRUPTION

Focus: Acts 9:3–5

Teaching Insight

- God interrupts incorrect perception
 - Clarity often comes through disruption
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Key Word

- Light (phōs) → revelation, truth revealed

Key: *Clarity is when truth interrupts what you thought was right.*

Reflection

What has God interrupted in your life recently?

SECTION 3: BLINDNESS AS PREPARATION

Focus: Acts 9:8–9

Teaching Insight

- Saul’s physical blindness reflected spiritual blindness
 - God removed sight to restore vision
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Key Word

- Blind (typhlos) → unable to see; spiritual limitation
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Key: *God will remove what you rely on to show you what’s true.*

Reflection

What has been removed from your life that may actually be preparation?

SECTION 4: SIGHT RESTORED (CLARITY)

Focus: Acts 9:17–18

Teaching Insight

- Clarity comes when obstruction is removed
 - Sight restored = understanding restored
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Key Word

- Scales (lepidēs) → coverings, obstructions
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Key: *Clarity removes what was blocking your understanding.*

Reflection

What “scales” might need to fall from your eyes?

SECTION 5: REDEMPTION OF THE PAST

Teaching Insight

- Paul’s past was not wasted
 - It was redirected
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Keys:

God didn’t waste who Paul was—He redirected it.

The same passion he used to persecute... he now used to produce.

Reflection

What part of your past have you labeled as wasted?

SECTION 6: WHAT CLARITY DOES

Teaching Insight

- Clarity redefines your past
- Clarity shifts your identity
- Clarity changes your movement

Key: *Clarity doesn't change what happened—it changes what it meant.*

APPLICATION (3 HELPFUL POINTS)

- 1. Identify where you lack clarity

What feels confusing right now?

- 2. Ask for understanding

- Shift from “God fix it” to
- “God show me”

✓ 3. Move with clarity

Take one step based on what you now understand

PRAYER

“God, renew my mind so I can understand what You are doing.
Remove anything that is blocking my clarity.
Help me to see clearly so I can walk confidently in who You’ve called me to be.”

DECLARATION

“I will not be limited by confusion.
God is renewing my mind.
Clarity is coming.
And I will walk in what He reveals.”

FINAL REMINDER

- Clarity changes everything
- Confusion is not the end—it’s a signal
- God is revealing truth
