Edward G. Robinson (born Emanuel Goldenberg; <u>Yiddish</u>: עמנואל גאָלדנבערג; December 12, 1893 – January 26, 1973) was a <u>Romanian-born American</u> actor of stage and screen during <u>Hollywood's Golden Age</u>. He appeared in 30 Broadway plays<sup>[1]</sup> and more than 100 films during a 50-year career<sup>[2]</sup> and is best remembered for his tough-guy roles as gangsters in such films as *Little Caesar* and *Key Largo*.

Mr. Friedman also has yahrzeit on the same day as Edward G. Robinson, and both of them attend the Hollywood Temple Beth-El that day. It is customary of course for a yahrzeit to daven before the omid, but Mr. Friedman, though by far the more regular worshipper, is blind; and so the leadership, one day each year, goes to Edward G. Robinson, who, it is said, davens very nicely, and respectfully waits until Mr. Friedman has finished the Shmonei Earei.

Mr. Friedman, whose grand-daughter Chana Rivka, is at present on her way to join a religious kibbutz in Israel, had also once been the Hebrew teacher of Jules Stein, who is head of MCA, the biggest calent agency in Hollywood. And Jules Stein's father Louis spent the last years of his life at Mr. Friedman's home.

Unfortunately, only the most gratuitous kinds of conclusions can be drawn from any of this data about Jewish life in Hollywood.

He also contributed regularly to to HTBE, which caught the attention of McCarthy's committee during the witch hunting for Communists in those years. He was caught up in the witch hunt, as a result of his support for groups that opposed the Nazis, but as it turned out, were affiliated with the Communist party.
