TECH TALK WITH BUBBA KLINE I-35 SPEEDWAY TECH

Hello my name is Bubba Kline and I'm the Technical Director at I-35 Speedway. Shawn asked me to write an article on the differences between the Grand Nationals that used to race at I-35 and our new Midwest Limited Late Models. I hope you enjoy the article and understand a little more about them.



First off all safety equipment is the same between both classes, remember safety comes first. Both classes are very similar in body wise but the Late Models are just a tad bit wider. If you notice when they come on the track the tires and wheels are a 14 inch tire and the wheels are aluminum to whereas the Grand Nationals are 8 inch tire and the wheels and have to be steel. The Limited Late Models wheels are a little wider and which allows them to get more power to the ground. When you look at the frames you will notice the difference: Grand Nationals have a stock production frame (Monte Carlo frame or Camaro frame which is the majority of them.) Late Models are totally fabricated from tubing and this is where the talent comes in building from the ground up.

The Engine rules: the Grand Nationals are limited to a 360 cubic inch steel headed motor. Limited Late Models are not restricted to a cubic inch rule they are also allowed to run aluminum heads. Late Models have more power but they are the same small block design. When you think of rear ends you would think they would run the standard 9 inch Ford which the Grand Nationals do, but Limited Late Models get the Winners Quick Change, there are several different kinds of Quick Changes, but that one is popular with the drivers.

Late Models can run several different packages of Shocks to where Grand Nationals can't have any bulb shocks, canisters shocks. But their wheel bases are the same.

This is just a little list to help you understand the differences between the two; but I wanted to tell you about some. We hope to see you at a track in the future. Remember to bring a friend.

And who doesn't love a free night of racing? Bring your CARB membership card and get in free to the races on CARB night. Valley Speedway is one of the longest running CARB-supported tracks. Valley's opening night is scheduled for Friday, April 5, 2019 and includes five classes of cars: Valley Powri Outlaw Sprints, B Modifieds, E Modifieds, Dirt Demons and Pure Stocks. Some other noteworthy nights of racing at Valley this year are:

- Friday, May 3 – Valley will host the Powri National Midgets, Powri WAR Series and Midwest Lightning Sprints in an all-open wheel race night! This will be a great night of racing, especially for all the sprint car lovers.
- The following weekend on Friday, May 10 is the King of Kansas City B Modifieds race, featuring B Modifieds, E Modifieds, Dirt Demons and Pure Stocks.
- In June the Powri WAR Series will be back again for an open-wheel night on June 7.
- Some other great shows at Valley will be Destruction in the Valley Demo Derby – who doesn't love the excitement of demo derby???
- In July Valley will have three great weeks of racing when they bring back the Monster Trucks with Monsters in the Valley by Blue Springs Harley Davidson on July 5, and Monsters in the Valley by Outlaw Harley Davison on July 6. Then on July 12 and July 13 Valley hosts Thunder in the Valley National Midgets.
- If that isn't a big enough schedule for you the following week July 19 is King of Kansas City non-wing sprints, with support classes B Modifieds, E Modifieds, Dirt Demons and Pure Stocks.
- Valley's scheduled final weekly points race will be September 27.
