### Student Disability Services

Student Disability Services (SDS) is part of Cornell Health, Student & Campus Life

Designated office at CU for determining eligibility for disability services and accommodations (for students) and then arranging for implementation

Goal: to ensure disabled students have equal access to their education

**5,443** students currently registered with SDS

### What to Expect When Working with SDS

- Process is student-initiated
  - Student submits self-disclosure
  - You can always talk with SDS first if you're not sure about submitting
  - O Documentation is NOT primary form of information
- Engage in an interactive process with SDS staff to determine reasonable accommodations
  - May be through email communication, meetings, or a mix of the two
  - SDS may connect with faculty or campus partners
  - NOTE: We don't disclose disability or diagnosis
- Develop self-advocacy skills through process
  - O Learn how to use accommodations effectively for you
  - O Notify SDS when there is a problem regarding your accommodations or access


#### ASSESS THE ACCESS, Not Diagnosis

- Focus on student experience
  - Impact of disability what's happening for the student?
  - Considering and affirming all aspects of a student's indentity
  - O Documentation is supplemental, not primary
- University Environment
  - Identify and minimize barriers that are University-imposed
  - O Consider the semester, the types of classes or academic environments
- O No two students' experiences are the same
- Accommodations are tools not always automatic fixes


#### SDS Website & Self-Disclosure Form
