Refuse To Be A Victim® is NRA's award-winning personal safety and crime prevention program. Strategies include home security, carjack avoidance techniques, cyber safety, and use of personal safety devices. This NRA course focuses on proactive courses of action, rather than reactive.

The Refuse To Be A Victim® seminar covers topics that pertain to both men and women. The information covered is appropriate for young adults to senior citizens. Seminars are available for private presentations to corporations, businesses, and other groups and clubs.
