## Parent Helpers

The Parent Rota is now up on the **NEW** notice board. It is open to parents (both Mummy & Daddy) or grandparents, whose child has been at Greenwood for a half term. Sometimes, if your child has been unsettled at pre-school, staff might delay asking you to participate in the rota at that particular time.

We would ask all parents to sign up to 2 half day sessions per term, if at all possible. Please ensure that this is a session your child attends. Coming in on parent rota is a positive experience both for the child and parent. Children enjoy showing their parents what they do when they are here and it is equally important for parents as they see what happens during the session and get a greater understanding of what the children are doing. We understand that it is often difficult when parents work and have such busy lives but it really is a worthwhile opportunity for both you and your child.

Unfortunately, at the present time, no siblings are able to attend the session. We understand that this can cause problems with childcare for siblings, but accidents with younger siblings can and do happen and also parent rota is considered a special time for you and your pre-school child to share if at all possible.

## Clothing

Please ensure your child is dressed appropriately for the weather. It would be advisable for children to have a coat in Pre-school at all times, just in case it rains.

### Naming your children's clothes

Please ensure that all removable clothing is clearly marked with your child's name.



## Reward Stars

We have in place a practice to encourage children to sit quietly and listen during the story time and other specific times when we wish them to sit quietly. We have had positive feedback and results over the terms, and will be continuing with this practice for forthcoming terms. If a child manages to sit quietly during the short period of the activity (and this means for the entire time not just for part of the time!), they will be given a 'special star' that they can take home to keep. We will be doing this about one or two times a week (not daily) so the children will not know what days we are doing this or when during the session! Please can you also encourage your child in this, as your extra support can only help them achieve this sooner. However, please don't feel discouraged if your child isn't able to achieve this yet as over time they will see other children being rewarded for their good behaviour and gain the self-control to do so for themselves.

If anyone wishes to discuss this at all, please speak to myself or another member of staff.
