ARE YOU A GOOD NEIGHBOR?

- 1. Personal Watercraft (PWC) are powerboats under Michigan law. They must be registered and carry a fire extinguisher if compartments could contain fumes. You must wear a flotation device (life jacket) while operating a PWC. Operation is only legal in the daylight.
- 2. Michigan Law requires a PWC to stay at least 150 ft. away from any boat and at least 100 ft. from any dock, raft, or swimming area. Only another PWC can operate closer.
- 3. Make sure you know how to operate your watercraft before going out. Proceed slowly until you learn how to handle your craft. Boater Safety classes are available and recommended.
- 4. Always wear your life jacket while under power, it could save your life or the life of a loved one.
- 5. Always watch for others on the water boaters, skiers, a dropped skier, swimmers and hazards, such as rafts or a slalom ski, etc.
- 6. Never operate your PWC while under the influence of drugs or alcohol, nor smoke where there is the possibility of gas fumes. Remember that a long day on the water can affect judgment and reaction time much like drugs and alcohol. Take breaks and slow down.
- 7. Please do not alter your PWC or boat to make it louder. The noise could cover up a call for help.
- 8. After dusk, do you use the proper lights on your boat and refrain from SPEEDING?
- 9. When driving your jet ski or speedboat, remember to go in a counterclockwise direction and operate in a safe manner.
- 10. Do you respect your fellow neighbors who are fishermen and give them a wide berth? You are responsible for any damage or injury your wake may cause, so please be aware of the other boats on the lake!
- 11. When water skiing, knee boarding or tubing, have at least two people in the boat: one to drive and one as a spotter. Water sports are a lot of fun if you have an extra pair of eyes to watch for other boats, swimmers, or obstructions and to keep an eye on the people you are pulling.
- 12. Remember, NO WAKE between 8:30 p.m. and 7:30 a.m. Monday thru Friday, and 8:30 p.m. to 9:00 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday, starting June 1st through September 15th.
- 13. Never do long distance swimming or diving without a boat escort or without proper flotation markers. Stay close to shore whenever possible.
- 14. Michigan State Law prohibits anyone under the age of 12 to operate a boat or personal watercraft (PWC). Children between the ages of 12 and 16 may legally operate a boat or PWC if they have a boater's safety certificate or are accompanied by an adult.
- 15. To keep Silver Lake clean, please:
 - DO NOT fertilize near the lake.
 - DO NOT burn near the lake.
 - DO NOT allow grass clippings to enter the lake.

REMEMBER: NO WAKE TIME AFTER 8:30 P.M.

There are three homes that were built before the turn of Twentieth Century.... All three were farm houses ...All the outbuildings and the huge 3 story barns are gone now..

First the Doane / Harington / Weir home at the corner of Doane and Silverside Dr. built in the 1850s. It sat abandoned for many years and then was given a new life by Mrs. Harington in the 60's and later the Weir's...

The second farm was the Squire /Norton / Driver / Engels home ... built just after the Civil War in 1868 or so. It was a large Dairy farm till 1945. Then a public bathing beach with a restaurant and bath house. Open from Memorial Day to Labor Day...

The third home was the Frank Berry / Peach home, The white house on the hill....Mr. Berry raised sheep, no location of a barn is known... The first Mr. Peach ran an ice house and making ice available to the surrounding area..
