PONTOON TRAILER AVAILABLE FOR USE BY MEMBERS

If you are new to the area, you may not know that SLIC has a pontoon trailer available for use (at no cost) to paid members. You must be a paid-up member of SLIC for the current year (2024) to use this trailer. The trailer is for local use on our lake only, as it has no license plate. The trailer is stored at 9185 Silverside Dr. (Chris & Jo Ann Williams' House). A key is also available from Dale French. Since the trailer is often in high demand, we ask that you return it within an hour. Each user must sign the trailer out; please do not pass it on to your neighbors since you are responsible for the trailer and its condition when you sign for its use.

ARE YOU A GOOD NEIGHBOR?

- 1. Personal Watercraft (PWC) are powerboats under Michigan law. They must be registered and carry a fire extinguisher if compartments could contain fumes. You must wear a flotation device (life jacket) while operating a PWC. Operation is only legal in the daylight.
- 2. Michigan Law requires a PWC to stay at least 150 ft. away from any boat and at least 100 ft. from any dock, raft, or swimming area. Only another PWC can operate closer.
- 3. Make sure you know how to operate your watercraft before going out. Proceed slowly until you learn how to handle your craft. Boater Safety classes are available and recommended.
- 4. Always wear your life jacket while under power, it could save your life or the life of a loved one.
- 5. Always watch for others on the water boaters, skiers, a dropped skier, swimmers and hazards, such as rafts or a slalom ski, etc.
- 6. Never operate your PWC while under the influence of drugs or alcohol, nor smoke where there is the possibility of gas fumes. Remember that a long day on the water can affect judgment and reaction time much like drugs and alcohol. Take breaks and slow down.
- 7. Please do not alter your PWC or boat to make it louder. The noise could cover up a call for help.
- 8. After dusk, do you use the proper lights on your boat and refrain from SPEEDING?
- 9. When driving your jet ski or speedboat, remember to go in a counterclockwise direction and operate in a safe manner.
- 10. Do you respect your fellow neighbors who are fishermen and give them a wide berth? You are responsible for any damage or injury your wake may cause, so please be aware of the other boats on the lake!
- 11. When water skiing, knee boarding or tubing, have at least two people in the boat: one to drive and one as a spotter. Water sports are a lot of fun if you have an extra pair of eyes to watch for other boats, swimmers, or obstructions and to keep an eye on the people you are pulling.
- 12. Remember, NO WAKE between 8:30 p.m. and 7:30 a.m. Monday thru Friday, and 8:30 p.m. to 9:00 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday, starting June 1st through September 15th.
- 13. Never do long distance swimming or diving without a boat escort or without proper flotation markers. Stay close to shore whenever possible.
- 14. Michigan State Law prohibits anyone under the age of 12 to operate a boat or personal watercraft (PWC). Children between the ages of 12 and 16 may legally operate a boat or PWC if they have a boater's safety certificate or are accompanied by an adult.
- 15. To keep Silver Lake clean, please:
 - DO NOT fertilize near the lake.
 - DO NOT burn near the lake.
 - DO NOT allow grass clippings to enter the lake.
- 16. Please do not play music with profane or vulgar lyrics on or near the lake.
- 17. A Sept. 2022 Michigan Dept. of Natural Resources report recommends the following: Boats operating in wake-surfing or wake-boarding modes should operate in water at least 15 feet deep Boats operating in wake-surfing mode or wake-boarding mode,during which boat speed, wave shapers, and /or ballast are used to increase wave height, should operate at least 500 feet from docks or the shoreline, regardless of water depth.

Fish Habitat

The Placing of Habitat in the lake went well. We had enough help to place 10 Fish Structures in the lake for Fish Habitat. We will be placing more Habitat for the fish into the lake this summer. These structures help to give the fish year-round habitat to live and thrive.

A good fish population is crucial for our lake to stay clean and give members better opportunity to catch healthy fish. Thank you everyone who voted to allow us to place these structures and to those who helped with building and placing these structures into the lake.

Fish Stocking Update:

2 years ago, we were able to put in around 500 small crappies from the Imlay City Fish farm. I am happy to report these crappies are doing very well in our lake and are growing like weeds. We recently went fishing for them and were catching healthy 8–14-inch crappies. Most of the fish we caught were released back into the lake to continue to spawn and grow the population. If you should happen to catch some of these crappies, we just ask you to be conservative. Keep a few but please try and release some back to the lake so we can continue to grow a healthy population again.

Last year we had planned to reintroduce Perch into the lake. We had an order into the fish farm for many months. But just before they were to deliver them, they had a pond failure and all their young perch died. So, we were unable to get those last year. This year we will try again and hope to be able to place them in our lake this fall.Over the years our Fish stocking has been very successful, we started several years ago introducing Fathead minnows and Golden shiners into the lake. Once we knew we had a good population of feeder minnows we started bringing in Red Ear Pan fish. We did 3 years of stocking them and now we have a great thriving population of Red ears. The Red Ears are great for our lake as their other common name is shell crackers. They love to eat the small white snail you see in our lake as well as the Zebra mussels. I have noticed a huge decline in Zebra muscles stuck to my dock since we introduced the Red Ears, so they are doing their job.

SILVER LAKE'S NORTH EAST SHORE

A Brief History of Silver Lake's North East Shore

Imagine you are driving on Silver Lake Rd. heading east from U.S. 23. You wind around a big sweeping "S" curve and come to a fork in the road, where you stay to the right. You are now looking at Silver Lake's northeast shore. Houses on the left are all tucked in close and the lake is a few yards from the road on your right. As you drive along, the road rises up giving you a beautiful vista of the lake. The land opens up and to your left, large homes sit back from the road. Then close to the road is a large gray house with white shutter and a large white deck. Next are a few more homes, set back a little, but you don't really notice because the view of the sun shining on the water captures your attention. The road drops down again as you go into a valley with houses only on the left, closer again to each other. Then, drive up a steep hill and you are at the junction of Silverside Dr. and Doane Rd.

Now stop here and turn around.... And go back in time about 100 years, say 1900, and it is now winter...... Go back down the hill. The road is dirt and gravel, and it is called Lake Side Dr. (not Silverside Dr.) Coming toward you is a team of horses pulling a wagon full of ice blocks covered with straw and a tarp, heading for South Lyon. There are two houses in this valley, both bungalow style, with big front porches and upstairs dormer windows looking out onto the lake... Maple trees, big oaks and several sycamore trees with speckled bark fill the valley. Up the next hill on your right you see open rolling fields, Down the road and on your right, about 300 feet or so, you see a large three story white barn, with a hug silo made of glazed brown tile shinning in the sunlight. To the east of the big barn sits a hip roof hog barn built with the same glazed tiles... As you drive a little

farther you see a small milk house near the road and farther back, out buildings, chicken coops, grain bins, a corn crib, and a forest of black walnut trees surrounding the back yard of a white two-story farm house. A windmill stands in the front yard. It is believed that many of these structures were built in the late 1870's... The William Squire family lives here with their three children. They were followed by the Norton family, then by the Drivers. Louie, wife Marge and daughter Jo Ann.

Just past the house is another open field and down the road by the water, just as the road starts to curve, you see a stone retaining wall with steps going down to the front door of a two story cottage, sitting not 20 feet from the road. It has a row of windows on each floor, facing the lake. Under these windows you can see large rocks put there to help protect the foundation because the cottage is so close to the lake. This is a summer cottage for relatives of the Norton family of Detroit, who own the Norton Hotel in Detroit, and the Norton Palmer in Windsor. On the right as you go around the curve in the road, you will see a beautiful white house high on the hill, this house was built in 1892 by Frank Barry, he patterned it after the Carla Villa in England. By the turn of the century Orange Peach lived there with his family.

Down by the water is a small country store, and an icehouse, owned & operated by the Peach family. Their descendants will live here for about 90 years. Orange's son Lemual & his wife Edna, and their daughter Celia, and Celia with her family, before moving to Arizona..

Next two cottages on the right, before you get to Silver Lake Rd. that are now gone.

Today..... The road is paved and way too much traffic, the ice house and store are gone. Now just a part of history... The farm was split up, the lake property that went with the farm was over 1,200 feet of lake frontage, allowing for 10 large lots with plenty of room for bigger homes and out buildings. The original farm house, built in the late 1870's is still there bigger and more beautiful than ever. Thanks Mike and Leslie Engles, and all the work they put into saving this beautiful home. The cottage at the curve is long gone, when the road gets close to the lake there are now 10 homes in the valley, two of them from the 1930's. A large home on the lakeside of the road, now replaces a small cottage also from the 30' before you head up the hill to Doane Rd.
