

Traidcraft

Fighting poverty through trade



I guess most of us enjoy a 'nice cup of tea'.
But who picked your tea?

Back breaking work in the harsh sun; poverty-level wages which can be deducted if you miss your targets; a lack of clean water, food and services like healthcare and education: this is the reality for tea workers behind some of the UK's most popular blends. For generations, tea workers in Assam have picked tea for the British market, but instead of being valued they have been impoverished. **However, the tide is turning.**

The Traidcraft campaign for the tea industry to be more transparent about where their tea comes from is beginning to reap rewards. Thousands of people have sent emails and postcards to tea companies to seek information about where their tea is grown. Previously, it was almost impossible to trace and scrutinise conditions and as tea workers didn't know who was buying their tea, it was much harder to call for basic rights to be met.

Currently, the brands Yorkshire Tea, Twinings, Tetley and Clipper have published their suppliers, and from this we can see where nearly half of the UK's tea comes from. Transparency means more scrutiny and power for the workers, enabling them to challenge unfair conditions on the tea estates.

Now, we need to take aim at PG Tips and Typhoo. PG Tips, owned by Unilever, is the biggest UK tea brand. Typhoo is smaller, but they pack tea for supermarkets like Tesco and Co-op. PG Tips and Typhoo both know the names and addresses of their suppliers but so far, they have avoided any questions. Traidcraft needs to ramp up the pressure and they need our help.

Here's what you can do.

Scientists have recently been advising about the decline of the bee due to insecticides and the new threat of global warming.



WHY CHRISTIANS SHOULD BE ENVIRONMENTAL ACTIVISTS



Introduction

How do you feel about being an activist in the cause of climate change, going on a protest march, picketing a coal burning power station? Well if these things are too physical for you there is another very effective way to be involved - it's called **Campaigning** and it brings results, as we will show over the next few months of Spotlight. Consider this article:



If you were a parent and you knew your child was being bullied at school, you'd think nothing of complaining to the Head Teacher and requesting urgent action to protect your son or daughter. You have a right and responsibility to care for your child and speak up on their behalf to those in authority who can take action.

If you don't, who will?

Even less than a bullied child can the natural environment stand up for itself - though it is giving us plentiful signs that it is suffering. Nature needs us to speak up for it, and there are good reasons why:

It's Biblical.

As Christians, we have a Biblical mandate to care for and love God's creation - because God does. Just as loving someone sometimes involves protecting them by speaking up in their defence, so our Biblical mandate to care for creation logically includes asking the authorities with the power to do so to nurture and protect nature.



Of course we should live lightly on God's earth as individuals - but it is not enough. Speaking up is simply the right thing to do.


