Dear Friends,

This will be my last letter to you until I return from Sabbatical in September. Three guest writers have been assigned to this task and I will enjoy reading about what is going on, albeit from a distance.

We have celebrated Easter in a number of different ways this year, using art and music, silence and meditation, food

and social events. The visual displays and pieces of art have been thought provoking and reached a number of people walking past. The Maundy Thursday vigil and the Good Friday walk/treasure hunt provided new ways of reflecting on being community. Easter Sunday started early and those who attended the beach service were invited to visualise the appearance of Jesus on the seashore and sharing breakfast together. We then came back to church to share a delicious cooked breakfast. Thank you to everyone who helped.

As we gathered for our 10.30 service, we were made aware of the terrible news from Sri Lanka about the targeted bombings of churches and hotels, with a large loss of life including those who were worshipping at Easter Sunday services. I am hoping that somebody else will be writing about the 31 of us who attended Spring Harvest this year. As a church leader it is always uplifting to see excitement about faith and prayer, however young or old they are. Do ask those who went about their experiences - not just "did you enjoy it?", but "what did you enjoy?" We are always open to taking more with us, so please ask Alison, Joy, Adam or Caroline if you think you might like to join us in Minehead from Easter Monday next year.

I am incredibly grateful for the gift of three months sabbatical. Here is a brief outline of what I intend to do. My sabbatical is entitled Fit to Lead and I will be looking at fitness for body, mind and spirit. We are starting with a twoweek holiday, visiting Barcelona, Rome and Gibraltar by sea as Geoff is unable to fly now. 



WE DID IT! By coming together and asking for change we've got the British tea sector to move from secrecy to become one of the most transparent supply chains – in less than a year.

This openness means we can find out where more than 70% of the tea in our supermarkets comes from. Most importantly it means tea workers, and local groups supporting them, can hold the British brands to account.

If you drink tea from Tetley, PG Tips, Clipper, and now Typhoo, you can visit their website (or ours) and find the list of their tea suppliers, including estates in Assam and elsewhere in the world.

"Thanks to the support of tea drinkers in the UK and around the world, now we know where the tea we pick is sold. That means we can ask British brands to ensure the standards they have promised are met. Thank you!" Stephen Lakra, President, All Adivasi Students Association of Assam

We asked the big brands to publish their Assam suppliers but **nearly all of them have gone beyond this and revealed their global lists** – providing a vital tool for change for tea workers all around the world. We can say that the first step towards a better future for tea workers in Assam is complete.

Ultimately these lists will enable local organisations and tea workers themselves to raise problems which their immediate tea estate management has not been able to address – either publicly or with the UK brands.

Do keep buying tea from Assam – especially from those brands which have published their lists. By buying, not boycotting, we are supporting an industry that provides livelihoods for more than a million people.

Christian Aid Week 12 - 18 May



Last month we gave you a taste of the life of Jebbeh Konneh, who is pregnant. Here is more of her story...

Sierra Leone is the world's most dangerous place to become a mum. Every day 10 women die from giving birth. In Sawula district, the community struggles with a clinic which has no electricity and only two delivery beds.

Jebbeh is heavily pregnant but as her baby grows, it's not joy that fills her heart, but fear. When Jebbeh's sister Fatmata went into labour, there were so few ambulances that Fatmata had no choice but to walk for three hours under the baking sun, to the nearest hospital. The journey was long and with every step Fatmata struggled to keep walking.

Jebbeh told us: 'My sister was crying out with hunger. She died on the side of the road. She never gave birth.'

This Christian Aid Week, together, we can make childbirth safe for mums and babies. Through our gifts and prayers, we can help give the world's poorest mums a chance to live.





WHY CHRISTIANS SHOULD BE ENVIRONMENTAL ACTIVISTS (cont.)

For the last two months, we have been talking about campaigning, which we know doesn't need to be a physically active activity. We can campaign just

as effectively by writing to our MP's, or signing petitions, for example.

The natural environment is clearly still suffering the ravages of man and this shows little sign of reducing, so make no mistake - it's urgent and speaking up for the environment is needed NOW!

Environmental trends are alarming, be they climate change, species loss, pollution or the growing plastic waste problem. God's creation in what we call 'nature' is hurting and that affects all creation, including us humans - from the Bangladeshi farmer displaced by sea level rise to the British children who may never see a hedgehog.

Yet there are solutions out there - from renewable energy to restoring habitat, from dealing with plastic waste to lifestyle changes such as eating less but better meat. Such solutions would have benefits for human wellbeing as well as for nature.



What God's hurting creation needs is for the solutions to be rolled out faster and at scale. This will happen to the degree that the public change their own behaviour but also urge bold action by both government and business locally, nationally and internationally.

The challenge to us as Christians, then, is to put our mouth where our faith is and speak up more for God's creation in the 21st century.
