No Nonsense News VOTING: A RIGHT, A PRIVILEGE, OR A RESPONSIBILITY?

Rights are given to all US citizens by the First Amendment.

A privilege is a benefit enjoyed by only those specifically granted it.

A responsibility is being answerable or accountable for something within one's power, control, or management.

Voting is a privilege and responsibility granted by those who fought for it through war, grassroots movements, or legislative battles. These struggles have kept the United States as an independent nation.

We have a responsibility to vote and honor those who have put their lives on the line to protect this privilege.

The most important issues to Republicans are economy, inflation and immigration. In contrast, Democrats consider Healthcare and abortion their leading issues.

Make sure everyone you know is registered to vote! Then VOTE! There are 3 ways to vote in the General Election

- 1. At your polling place on election day (6am to 8pm, Tuesday, November 5).
- 2. In-person early voting: From Saturday, October 26 to Sunday, November 3, 2024. Vote at any

of your county's designated in-person early voting sites. Check VOTE.NJ.GOV. Hours: Monday–Saturday, 10:00 a.m.–8:00 p.m.& Sunday, 10:00 a.m.–6:00 p.m. No appointment is necessary.

- 3. Vote By Mail: Apply for a mail-in ballot. Go to VOTE.NJ.GOV or contact the County Clerk. VOTE and RETURN your ballot one of the following ways:
 - a. Secure Ballot Drop Box: Place your mail-in ballot in one of your county's secure ballot drop boxes by 8pm Tuesday, November 5. For locations see VOTE.NJ.GOV.
 - Board of Elections Office: Deliver your mail-in ballot in person to your county's Board of Elections Office by 8pm Tuesday, November 5.
 - c. Mail: MUST be postmarked on or before 8pm Tuesday, November 5 and received by the Board of Elections on or before Monday, November 11.

NOTE: Mail-in ballots CANNOT be returned to your early voting site or polling place Ocean County Election Board is at 129 Hooper Ave, Toms River, NJ 08754-2006. Any questions? Call 800-452-5254
