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NEURO-DIVERSE VIRTUAL CLUBHOUSE FOR TWEENS AND TEENS OFFERING ENRICHMENT, SOCIALIZING, FAMILY SUPPORT AND AUTISM EDUCATION

Given a window into our Clubhouse this winter, you would be warmed by the sound of live music, lit up at the sight of artful visuals, or touched by the connections our students were making- both socially and neurally. Welcome to Dandelion Clubhouse - the home turf of neuro-unique tweens and teens.

Our Brain Science class is "making headway" with students experiencing their frontal lobes in action. Through lively drama games and tactile partner activities, students are planning, prioritizing, and organizing up a storm. Finding lost items (shown above) organizing virtual spaces, packing a backpack for a hike- these essential life skills are now infused with positive emotions, a sense of purpose, and self-efficacy. Students were eager to show off "before and after" pics in our frontal lobe challenge- clean your actual room!

In Global Mystery Adventures, we traveled to Tanzania to do a virtual climb of Mount Kilimanjaro. With 5 different weather climates, students were given the challenge to dress themselves for each weather zone. We also studied the honey bee project- where Maasai women are saving the habitat of Big Cats. African music filled the air as we capped off the class with a Maasai inspired jumping contest. Oh, and can you tell the difference between a leopard roar and a lion roar? Our students can!


Dandelion Drama will be performing at Qrkcon - a virtual gaming conference in May.

Keena's Ph.D. Update

Keena is rounding the final stretch into her Ph.D. in literacy and will begin her dissertation this spring! Keena has years of experience working in both mainstream and special ed settings. Her dissertation will focus on autistic students who can decode to the point of fluency but cannot comprehend what they read. Keena explains, "There is a complex list of factors of why autistic students struggle to comprehend the storyline, including limited perspective-taking skills, an inability to understand figurative language, lack of metacognitive facility to monitor the passage, and/or poor SEL competency." Keena cannot wait to share insights with you along the research adventure as she explores how interventions such as incorporating drama and multi-sensory supports impact the reading comprehension in her research participants. Keena offers private literacy tutoring to neurotypical students 5-12 and students with learning differences 5-17.
