NO RIGHT WAY begs to be authentic, gritty and raw. Full of pathos and honest emotion, NO RIGHT WAY offers an opportunity for those rare moments of heartbreaking beauty rising from the rubble of one too many squandered lives.

The story's structure has been architected in the service of the main character's struggles - comprising his rise, fall, and prospect of redemption. The screenplay invokes cinematically enhanced themes that arise organically from the main character's environs: from a socioeconomically divided working-class town bordered by idyllic rural landscapes to the unrelenting harsh realities of imprisonment.

Despite all odds and a system stacked against him, our main character's ultimate realization of a hard-fought redemption will touch even the hardest of hearts.

NO RIGHT WAY promises to be pure heart and soul and, as such, a much-welcomed departure from the all-too-familiar urban street tropes and clichés.

Roger Goff is an entertainment lawyer and producer in Los Angeles, California. In over 30 years as an entertainment professional and attorney, Roger has handled hundreds of transactions across the entire industry spectrum including film, television, music, digital media and entertainment technology. He has represented financiers, as well as producers, directors, writers, actors and other artists and entrepreneurs.

Prior to becoming an attorney, Roger worked in radio and television broadcasting, commercial production, advertising and as a studio musician. He holds an FCC license as a broadcast engineer and graduated from the studio guitarists program at Musicians Institute (in addition to receiving his B.A. from UCLA and his law degree, with honors, from Loyola Law School in Los Angeles). He began his legal career as a corporate attorney handling mergers and acquisitions and private securities transactions. He quickly transitioned to the music industry and spent many years representing independent record labels.

As an attorney in the film industry, Roger has handled financing and production for over a hundred films, including the Academy Award winning *Dallas Buyers Club*, *Welcome to the Rileys* (produced by Ridley Scott), *Splinter*, *American Gun*, and the soon-to-be-released *The Space Between* starring Kelsey Grammer. He has also been an executive producer on several films, including most recently *Man Down*, starring Shia Labeouf, Gary Oldman and Kate Mara, *Krystal*, directed by William H. Macy and starring Rosario Dawson, Kathy Bates and Nick Robinson, *Cut Throat City*, starring Ethan Hawke, Terrence Howard, Wesley Snipes and Kat Graham, and *The Tiger Rising* starring Dennis Quaid and Queen Latifah. Roger is a producer on the upcoming feature, *The Locksmith*, starring Ryan Phillippe, Kate Bosworth and Ving Rhames.



SCOTT MCCULLOUGH DGA, VES - DIRECTOR

Scott McCullough is best known for commercials for Pepsi, NASCAR, Ford, GM, Budweiser, Kubota, Target, NAPA, EA Sports, and many other Fortune 500 clients. Notably, Paul Newman personally requested McCullough to direct his final motion picture appearance featuring his Champ Car racing team.

Motion pictures in active development include the dark comedy "American Saviors" (8M), The biopic/drama "No Right Way" (18M) the Vietnam film with Martin Sheen "Captain for Dark Mornings" (24M), road/heist "No Cops with Wedding Rings" (20M), horror/action 26 Floors (14M), and McCullough served as a co-writer on the music biopic featuring Sublime's legendary front man Brad Nowell in "What I Got" (8M). Series projects include creator/director for the veteran based dramatic series "Spent Rounds" and "Holiday Motel."

McCullough collaborated directly with music legend Prince during one of his most successful times in his career including the gold RIAA rated (over 1M sales) "Gett Off", "Diamonds and Pearls" and "Sexy M.F." home videos along with over a dozen live concerts and projects.

McCullough was the creator, writer, and director for R.J. Reynolds Thunder Theater 70mm NASCAR experience film 100% and No Bull, described as the world's largest mobile theater and first of its kind immersive in-theater effects - now known as 4-D.

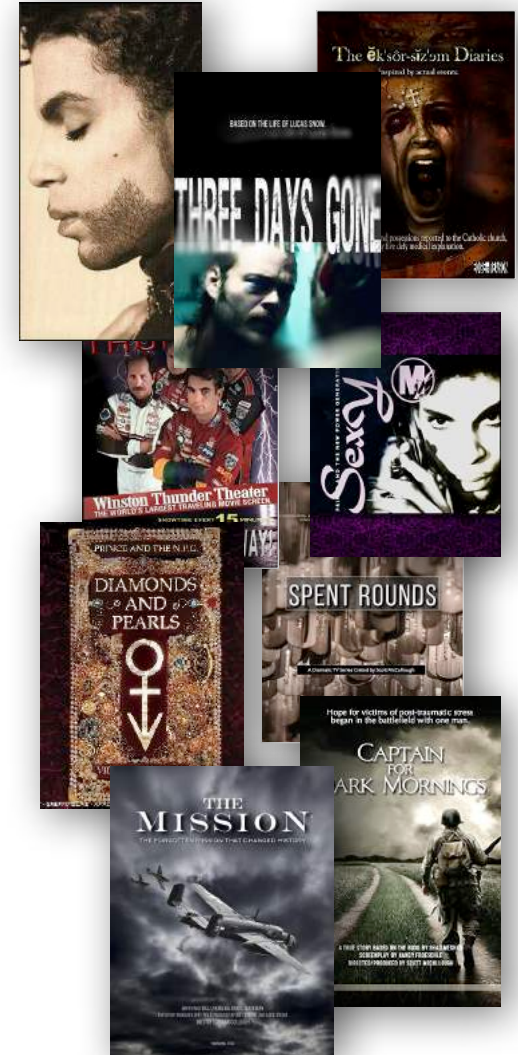

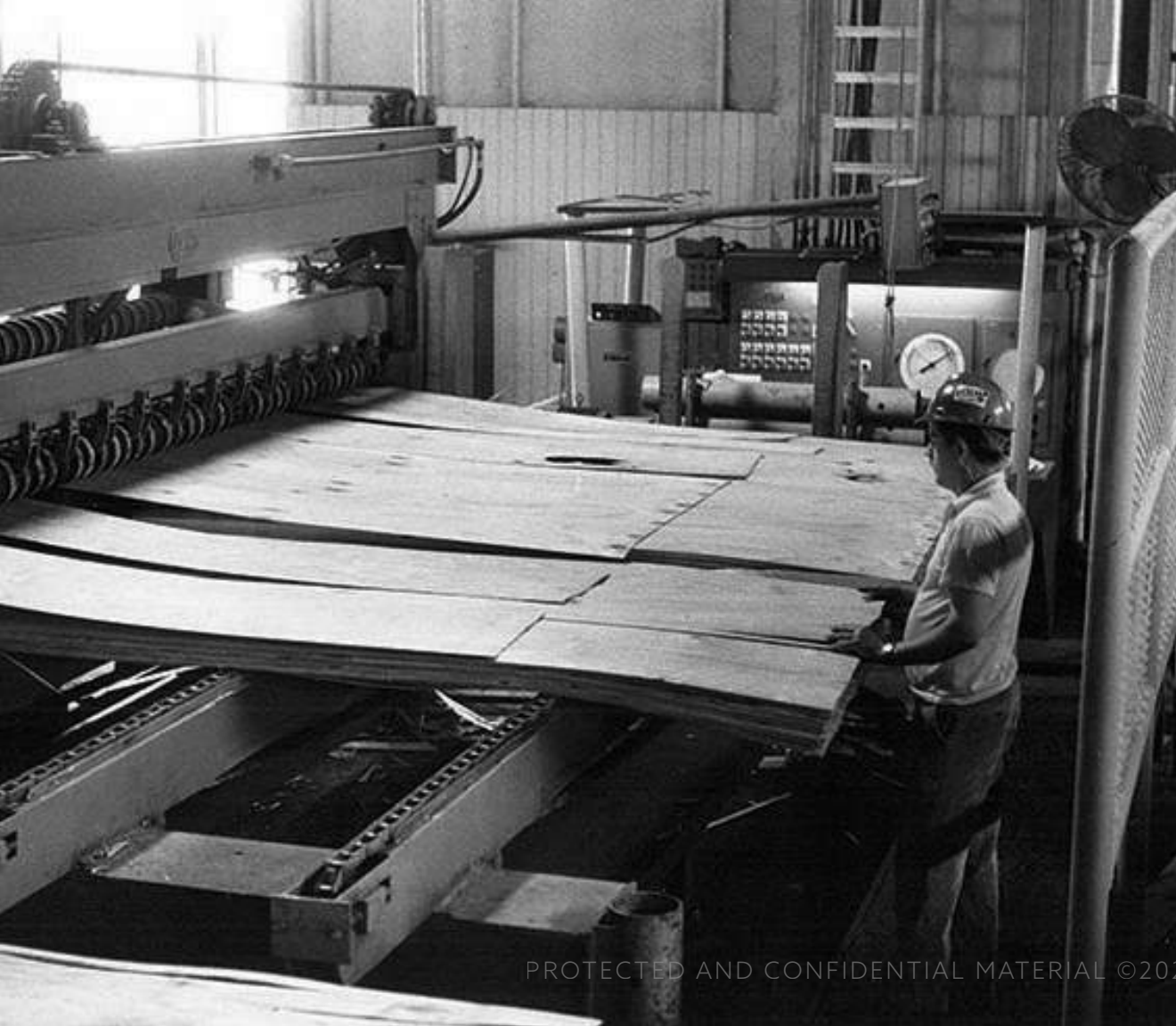

CLAY AYERS - WRITER | STORY CONSULTANT

A distinct voice in the film industry, Clay Ayers is known for his highly refined and iconoclastic sense of story and structure. Taking on projects ranging from biopics to psychological thrillers to inspiring urban dramas, he infuses his stories with a rich sense of character and human fallibility.

It was at Portland State University that Ayers first discovered his talent for writing. Following a successful stint as a copywriter, he was recognized for his creative vision when he wrote the stage play "Kicking", and subsequently was invited to join a Portland-based film group to develop the project "Netherland".

Ayers was eventually lured to Hollywood with encouragement from Warner Brothers Studios for his early scripts, "Going Straight" and "The Closer." While continuing to hone his skills on character-driven screenplays like "Corporate Raiders," Ayers' background with motorcycles led him to Paisano Publications where (as a writer/Associate Editor) he became known for his recognizable style in magazines like Easyriders, Biker, In the Wind, and VQ. After helping launch Quick Throttle, a magazine that caters to street-racing, Ayers became the show runner for Easyriders around the country.

It was during this time that Ayers's script, "No Cops With Wedding Rings", caught the attention of Quentin Tarantino's A Band Apart (Pulp Fiction, Kill Bill) who hired Ayers to write on multiple, consecutive feature projects for A Band Apart/Miramax.

Ayers then loaned his pen to Universal Studios #1 box office thriller "The Watcher" (Keanu Reeves, James Spader, Marisa Tomei), and went on to be a commissioned writer for 20th Century Fox. Ayers's unique background and advocacy work with (at-risk) urban youth led to his distinguished role as the keynote speaker for all of Los Angeles County Correctional Facilities and, more recently, he was honored to write "What I Got" - the story of Sublime's Bradley Nowell.

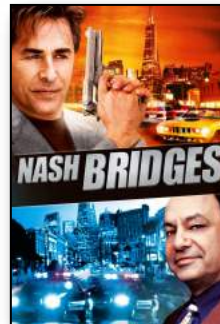
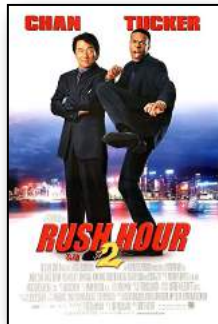
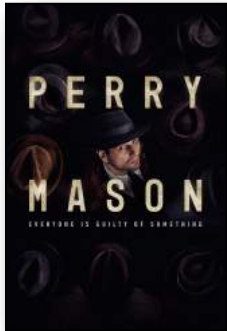


STUART YEE - PRODUCER | ACTOR

When Terrence L. Gallman was 16 years old, his life was defined by drugs and violence. Growing up in South Carolina, Gallman was introduced to drugs by his stepfather, and the path of self-destruction eventually led Gallman to a career of dealing drugs. It was no wonder that he was eventually arrested and convicted of drug conspiracy. During his 12-year incarceration, he could have continued on that self-destructive past, but he chose otherwise.

Determined to let his family and friends know he was more than his past, he used writing as a way to express his deepest, heartfelt emotions and penned his first book, *Love's Journey: The Road Less Traveled*, followed by his second book *FINDING ME*, the subject of the feature film *NO RIGHT WAY* in the works that exposes the real truth about the harsh realities of being incarcerated and the process of finding true identity and claiming inner power and last the book *WALL STREET BONDS: THE URBAN RENAISSANCE* to help integrate people into the Global Financial Markets.
