Australia–India Relations

Labor Party (ALP)

- Prime Minister Anthony Albanese has actively engaged with India, attending the Australia–India Annual Leaders' Summit in March 2023 and hosting Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Sydney in May 2023.
- The ALP government implemented the Australia–India Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement (AI-ECTA) in December 2022, enhancing trade and investment between the two nations.

Coalition (Liberal–National)

- The Coalition has historically supported strong ties with India, but recent campaigns have focused more on domestic issues.

- Aims to triple incentives for doctors to bulk-bill, investing \$8.5 billion into Medicare.
- Supports clean energy investments and infrastructure development, potentially benefiting related industries.

Coalition (Liberal–National):

- Plans to repeal electric vehicle tax breaks, projecting a \$3 billion saving.
- Pledges to increase defense spending to 3% of GDP, focusing on national security industries.
- Advocates for tax cuts and incentives to stimulate business growth.

Assessment: *The Coalition's policies may favor traditional business sectors through tax incentives, while Labor's investments in healthcare and infrastructure could benefit businesses.*



Hindu Community and Religious Freedoms

Labor Party (ALP)

- Proposed funding for Hindu, Tamil, Jain, and Sikh community centers, which received mixed reactions from the Indian diaspora.
- Faced challenges passing a religious discrimination bill, raising concerns about the protection of religious freedoms under a potential minority government influenced by the Greens.

Coalition (Liberal-National)

- Supports maintaining religious exemptions in anti-discrimination laws, aligning with various faith-based institutions' interests.
- Emphasizes the protection of religious freedoms, which may resonate with Hindu communities concerned about religious rights.

Assessment: *The Coalition appears more aligned with preserving religious freedoms, which could be a priority for Hindu communities.*
