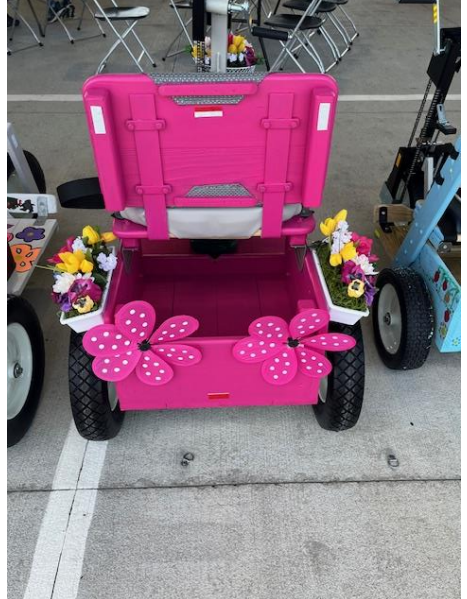


We gave free novelty sunglasses to kids and free readers to adults.
