JUNE 4TH, 2026

The Ziebach County Commissioners met in regular session at 1:00 PM with Rick Farlee, Shane Farlee, Tucker Stocklin, and David Pesicka present. Rick Farlee called the meeting to order.

MINUTES: Comm. Shane Farlee moved to approve the minutes as presented, seconded by Comm. T. Stocklin, all voted aye, motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS: Adam Kohler contacted Comm. S. Farlee to ask if he can now get the rest of his road gravel to his new house now that he is living there. Jeff said he will be put on the list!

NEW BUSINESS: Auditor J. Donovan let the board know that there will be a RUNOFF election on July 28th, 2026, for 2 Republican Governor Candidates to see who will move to the ballot for the General election in November.

DIESEL QUOTES: The Highway Department called for quotes for #2 dyed diesel on May 11, 2026. The following quotes were received: Agtegra - #2 Dyed DSL, \$4.45; Farmers Union Oil – No quote was received. The quote from Agtegra was accepted.

28TH, 2026. As no one appeared in opposition thereto and the appropriate fee being received, Comm. D.

Pesicka moved to approve the licenses, seconded by Comm. T. Stocklin, all voted aye, motion carried.

DEPUTY TREASURER & AUDITOR TRAINING IN PIERRE – June 11th, 2026, both deputies will be attending

training in Pierre, seconded by Comm. D. Pesicka, all voted aye, motion carried.

ROD – JOHN DEERE: No one attended from John Deere for the bill that was presented in May’s meeting.

Stocklin motioned to approve to pay the bill for repairs one of the Bulter Cat patrols that was traded in,

seconded by Comm. S. Farlee roll call vote was requested Rick – Yes, Bill – absent, David – No, Shane –

yes, Tucker - Yes, with the major yes, motion carried.

TRACTOR QUOTES – The board looked over various quotes that have been submitted they have decided

to table any decisions for this month and rerun the advertisement for next month’s meeting. Comm. S.

Farlee moved to approve of re-advertising for tractor quotes for next month's meeting, seconded by T.

Stocklin, all voted aye, motion carried.

HWY. DEPT. REPORT: Jeff Jensen, Highway Superintendent, presented his written report to the board.

The roads department has been chipping away at their list of roads that need to be bladed and graveled.

Jeff also informed the board that he has received the arm shafts for the new patrols from Mobridge

Manufacturing for cheaper than his first quote from RDO. Jeff also informed the board that he has been

doing some spraying for Canadian Thistle. At this time, that is all Jeff has to report.

SHERIFF'S REPORTS: Gary Cudmore, Sheriff presented his monthly vehicle reports to the Board and commented on recent law enforcement activities. Activity is picking up. There have been a few incidents in town, which he could not give any specifics as there are ongoing investigations.

OTHER BUSINESS:

- Auditor Donovan informed the board that she will be getting Budget Requests out to Department Heads in June.
- Security Camera Systems- Shane Penfield will be contacting Tiegan Clark for a quote.

PRIMARY ELECTION CANVASS: The Board canvassed the votes from the June 2nd, 2026, Primary Election held in Ziebach County. Comm. S. Farlee moved to approve the results as entered on election night to be reported to the Secretary of State's Office, seconded by Comm. T. Stocklin, all voted aye, motion carried. No corrections were found.

POST ELECTION AUDIT DRAW: Following the canvass, the auditor must draw for the post-election audit. This is the first year that the state is implementing a post-election audit. The Post Election Audit must take place within fifteen days following the completion of the state canvassing of a primary and general election. The audit is open to the public. The audit requires a manual count of 5% of the voting precincts, and a minimum of 100 ballots to be counted. Two races must be audited. One must be a statewide contest. The review of the voted ballots is to verify whether the equipment used to count votes works properly and yielded the correct results. A random draw was conducted by the Ziebach County Auditor at the conclusion of the canvas, and the following precincts were designated for the Audit:

Red Scaffold Precinct with a total of 17 votes cast.

Bridger Precinct with a total of 5 votes cast.

North Dupree, South Dupree, and Redelm (combined) precinct, with a total of 81 votes cast.

A random draw was conducted by the Ziebach County Auditor at the conclusion of the canvas and the following races were designated for the Audit:

1. Governor’s Race
2. State House District 28 Race

A total of 103 ballots will be manually counted, and the results will be compared to the tabulator’s result. The results of the audit will be shared at the July Commissioner’s meeting.
