

Claverton Pumping Station

When you walk along a canal towpath, surrounded by trees, birds and calm water, it is hard to imagine that these waterways were once the highways of the industrial revolution. These man-made rivers, dug by the hard labour

of thousands of workers, allowed goods from Bath and Bristol to be delivered directly to London without relying on dirt-track roads. Not being a natural watercourse, the huge machines that pumped water into the canals were a marvel of the late Georgian era. Very of these pumps have survive survived, but probably the most unique canal pump is just a stones throw from Bath, and is still fully operational.

Claverton Pumping Station, unlike most of the canal pumps, is water rather than steam powered.

Its 200 year old waterwheel is one of the most powerful in the country. It drives the same beam engine and pumps as steam

engines of the era, but without the dirt and pollution from burning coal. The pumping station is still put into operation once a month by volunteers, providing a unique way experience the industrial revolution.

Claverton Pumping Station is open on the second Tuesday and the second Saturday of each month from April until October. We open from 10 am until 5 pm (Last entry 4:30), but the pump is run only on the Saturday. There is no parking at the station, we recommend either taking the D1 bus from Bath, or walking along the towpath from the car park at Dundas aqueduct. Entry is £10 per adult when running, and £5 per adult if the machine is static, children under 16 go free.



Volunteers wanted!

In 1822 William Beckford sold the Fonthill Estate and moved to Bath, where

MUSEUM he soon began building another tower to house his books and collections. Now the only museum in the world dedicated to exploring Beckford's story, Beckford's Tower and Museum is embarking on a major project to conserve the building, transform the museum and open up the landscape.

The Tower is in urgent need of conservation, having been added to the National 'At Risk' Register in 2019. The impact of a changing climate has led to higher concentrations of rainfall and we need to conserve the Lantern at the top of the building. This also requires new and ongoing maintenance to ensure its long-term conservation in light of this changing environmental issue. In addition to addressing this conservation need and creating a new museum experience inside the building, our project will also restore the Grotto Tunnel, improve access to the cemetery and create new footpaths and trails for the lost Tower landscape, and introduce new renewable energy systems. This project will also enable us to create a new museum experience that will reveal more about Beckford's life including the wealth he gained from the Transatlantic Slave Trade, his sexuality and isolation, as well as his creative life as a writer, composer and collector.

The project will cost £3.4m and with support from the National Lottery Heritage Fund (NLHF) our fundraising target is £400,000 with a deadline of the end of May 2022. We are therefore thrilled that Lord Margadale has offered all of the proceeds from this event, to support the Tower project.

During the day you can wander through beautiful formal gardens with mixed planting of shrubs, herbaceous perennials, bulbs and annuals. Enjoy old and new sculptures including a water feature by William

Pye. Refreshments available to purchase, there will be stands where you can pick up gifts and treats, as well as a silent auction and tombola.







75 YEARS OF ANGLO-DUTCH FRIENDSHIP CELEBRATED

Eight decades of international friendship between the cities of Bath and Alkmaar in the Netherlands was celebrated in the Guildhall by members and supporters of the Bath-Alkmaar Twinning Association (BATA), and the Rotary Club of Bath.



The link with the Dutch City began in March 1945, after a Jewish man from Alkmaar, Eli Prins, escaped to Bath, and made many friends here, including Rotarians. As soon as the War finished, a citywide Alkmaar Appeal swung into operation, raising money and collecting clothing and cooking items to help those most affected by the German occupation. The campaign was publicised with a small barrel organ, which was wheeled around Bath and neighbouring towns.

Over the last eight decades, thousands of residents from Alkmaar and Bath have visited each others' city, with many sports clubs, musical groups, schools and other organisations taking advantage of a warm friendship first forged out of the tragedy of war.

After Deputy Mayor of Bath, Cllr Yukteshwar Kumar welcomed guests, and author Aletta Stevens read some moving passages from her book telling the full story of how the link came about, "The Remarkable Journey of Mr Prins".

Rotary President Simon Spalding, speaking to guests, said: "The spirit of Rotary which moved members to launch the Alkmaar Appeal in 1945 is alive today: I am delighted to report the Club has recently collected and donated £10,000 to the Help Ukraine Appeal."

BATA Chairman, Chris Davies, thanked all who were helping keep this special city-link alive. "When we planned this event, we never imagined we would once again be seeing the horrors of war in Europe with heart-breaking



If you have money or property and you became unable to deal with your affairs because of an accident or illness your assets may become frozen. 

This Mental Health Awareness Week, we focus on the theme of loneliness. Recognising the many different causes and effects of loneliness has never been more important.

Loneliness and isolation can be experienced by anyone, whether we are alone or part of a wider family or network. For some, being alone can be a positive situation, in which they do not feel lonely - they may enjoy spending time alone. Those who are part of a family or group may feel disconnected and isolated - despite not being physically alone, they may experience loneliness.

Loneliness can affect our mood and wellbeing on many levels. Meaningful connections with others are beneficial to our mental health and wellbeing. A chat with a friend or close relative can lift our mood if we are feeling low. A walk in the park when someone may say 'hello', or a friendly check-out in a shop, can often brighten our day. It can be easy to overlook these little moments which combine to reduce feelings of loneliness and help keep us mentally well.

Come and meet some familiar fantastical creatures (and quite a few natural ones) extracted from the pages of the historic books and boxes of specimens in Bath Royal Literary and Scientific Institution Collections and now appearing in an exciting new exhibition.



We grow up with monsters inhabiting our stories and dreams. The beasts of ancient myth and legend — magical unicorns, fire-breathing dragons, writhing sea monsters, cryptic chimeras and others — have gripped the human imagination for centuries. Inhabiting dark and mysterious places, with strange behaviors and destructive powers, they were once seriously feared, at a time when the boundary between superstition and reality was blurred. Yet it's possible these myths were inspired by living reptiles or finds of fossil 'dragon bones' belonging to extinct 'terrible lizards' or dinosaurs, as they later became known.

Medieval bestiaries beautifully illustrated the strangeness of these creatures. They lurked in the mysterious corners of early maps, with the warning 'Here be dragons', and travellers returned from distant parts with tales of hair-raising encounters. But in the 17th century scholars began to question whether these phenomena actually existed. Using scientific methods, they began to impose order and clarity on the natural world. As new continents were explored, a rich array of extraordinary new animals and plants were formally described. Here were creatures quite as weird as the ones in medieval pictures, but now they were being illustrated in vivid and accurate detail.

While we no longer feel the same horror these beasts could arouse in earlier times, we meet them today in our films, books and video games where they retain the power to scare us. We feel uneasy at the ability of science to create hybrid organisms containing human cells and those of another species. There is also the tantalising prospect that life forms, just as strange and exotic as the legendary ones of the past, may be there to discover in the uncharted lands beyond our planet.
