A WORD FROM SCRIPTURE - Luke 17:11-19

¹¹ Now on his way to Jerusalem, Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. ¹² As he was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy met him. They stood at a distance ¹³ and called out in a loud voice, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!" ¹⁴ When he saw them, he said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed.

¹⁵ One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. ¹⁶ He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him—and he was a Samaritan.

¹⁷ Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? ¹⁸ Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹ Then he said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well."

Verses 12-13 'As he was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy met him. They stood at a distance and called out in a loud voice, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!". Jesus enters a village and is met by ten lepers. Leprosy, a skin disease, led not only to physical pain, sickness, and mortality—it also meant the sufferers were social outcasts. They are in a desperate situation. So, they cry out to Jesus for mercy. "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us."

Verse 14 "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed" When Jesus saw them, he gives them simple instructions. They are to go and show themselves to the priest. This was the appropriate action when someone was better, to prove that they had really been released from their disease.

Jesus heals ten lepers in this passage, but only one of them, a Samaritan, returns to express gratitude. This Samaritan recognizes the blessing he received and falls at Jesus' feet, 'Thanking' Him. It serves as a powerful reminder for us to acknowledge and express gratitude for the blessings we receive from God. Just like the Samaritan, we should not take God's blessings for granted but instead return to Him with a heart full of thanksgiving.

Prayer –Loving God, your word reminds us to 'give thanks in all circumstances for this is God's will for us in Christ Jesus'. We come this day with a heart of thanksgiving for who you are our Lord and Saviour. We thank you for your goodness and love, for new every morning is your love. **AMEN.**
