



A Prayerful Reflection

Take time to sit quietly and ask Jesus to be present with you in a new way this week. And as we prepare to pray, you may find it helpful to reflect on the words from the following hymn below:

CMP 51 (Verses 1&2)

Be thou my vision, O LORD of my heart; naught be all else to me, save that thou art.
Thou my best thought, by day or by night waking or sleeping, Thy presence my light.

Be Thou my wisdom, Thou my true Word, I ever with thee, Thou with me LORD, Thou my great Father, I Thy true son, Thou in me dwelling, and I with thee one.

A WORD FROM SCRIPTURE - Psalm 139:1-10

¹O LORD, you have searched me and you know me. ² You know when I sit and when I rise, you perceive my thoughts from afar. ³ You discern my going out and my lying down, You are familiar with all my ways. ⁴ Before a word is on my tongue You know it completely, O LORD. ⁵ You hem me in – behind and before, You have laid your hand upon me. ⁶ Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain. ⁷ Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence?. ⁸ If I go up to the heavens, you are there, if I make my bed in the depths, you are there. ⁹ If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, ¹⁰ even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast.

Psalm 139 is a psalm attributed to David, it's a psalm of wisdom and praise. It describes the attributes of God, the active qualities by which God relates to His people. In this psalm David marvels at God's amazing characteristics. God knows everything about him: where he goes, all David's thoughts and everything about his conduct. The Lord knows what David will say even before David says it. There is no place David can go that God isn't already present. The key word of the psalm is **'Know'**,.... God knows (verses 1,2,4,6) These features highlight the psalms theme - God's intimate knowledge of His people.

When David said, 'You have searched me and know me', he was stating a truth that is equally relevant for us today. He knows you and he knows me, intimately. We should always remember the incredible privilege we have as His children - and though we may not understand how this knowledge is possible - let us trust every day of our lives, that no matter where we are in life, the Lord is our light and our strength. He watches over us and stands by our side.

Heavenly Father, what joy it is to know that You 'know' everything about me, and even the things that I do wrong, can never separate me from Your unfailing love. Help me to live out this truth in my life, and may I do only those things that are pleasing in Your sight, in Jesus name I pray, AMEN
